We will meet our guide, Squire Richard Hillman, at Market House Plaza which is at the head of the Dock & the bottom of Main Street and where there are restrooms (in the adjacent Market House). Also, note that there is a free shuttle on West Street that goes down to the Dock. It's a small purple bus. There are signs on West Street near Gotts that indicate a "purple bus stop."

The Annapolis State House is an iconic landmark in Annapolis. The Maryland State House is the oldest U.S. state house in continuous legislative use, dating to 1772 and houses the Maryland General Assembly and the offices of the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor. In 1783 and 1784, it served as the capitol building of the United States Congress and is where Ratification Day, the formal end of the American Revolutionary War, occurred.

Toward the end of the tour (approximately 12:15 PM), we will meet Delegate Heather Bagnall in an adjacent building for a brief summary of the highlights of the recent session.
