- children were safer - 96% of their measured youth reported a stable condition of well being.
- better prepared - Older teens earned workforce certifications in hospitality, restaurant management, welding, and forklift.
- smarter - Young children came to their preschool in record numbers, elementary and middle school students maintained studies year round, and 91% of eligible teens earned a high school diploma (or equivalent).
- working - 100% of eligible teens were employed.
- and families stayed together - 83% of families maintained custody.
