WORSHIP NOTE
This morning's opening hymn, "Christ, upon the Mountain Peak" (UMH No. 260), is an example of a hymn that paints the text through the music. Peter Cutts' tune eloquently depicts Brian Wren's text by striding up the mountain peak and at the Transfiguration, striding down again transposed ("transfigured") to another key. The distinctly twentieth-century harmonic context is skillfully composed in the characteristic manner of the music of Paul Hindemith (1895-1963).
