Gratz College's Tuttleman Library Expands Its Collection

The Gratz College community is thrilled about the explosion of new titles available through the Tuttleman Library in the form of ebooks. Director of Library Services Nancy Nitzberg describes the almost 8,000 new titles as “a treasure trove of recently published monographs by reputable scholars,” emphasizing that “these books are not reprints of classics, but rather, recent scholarly books that very much pertain to the programs in our graduate level curriculum.”

The ebooks are available through JSTOR, an electronic database of scholarly books, journals and primary sources. Gratz students, faculty and staff can access these books on the Gratz website through the JSTOR ebooks link at the bottom of the [Subscription eResources page](#). In other library news, [a new webpage](#) has been launched that includes cataloged and digitized pamphlets from the era of National Socialism (1930s and 1940s). Described in [the last issue of the Insider](#), these pamphlets were serendipitously discovered stored in a box in the library stacks. The pamphlets are primary sources that provide insight into the period before and during the Holocaust. The titles listed in blue on this new webpage have already been digitized, and the page will continue to be updated as new titles are added and additional pamphlets are scanned.
