Professor Josh Gutoff's Exciting Week

On February 23, Professor Gutoff, director of the Gratz master's program in Jewish education, gave a talk at Brown University for the [Creative Scholars Project](#). Professor Gutoff's presentation was entitled "Creative Empathy: Ethical Thinking as an Imaginative Act." During his discussion, he sought to answer an intriguing question: "Can we approach morality with the same sense of creativity that artists and designers bring to their work?"

One week later, Professor Gutoff received an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from The Jewish Theological Seminary. He and 54 other members of the Rabbinical Assembly were [honored](#) for having "served the Jewish community with distinction for 25 years or more." The honorees came from all over the United States, as well as from Canada, Israel and Switzerland. They included congregational rabbis, Jewish communal professionals, educators and chaplains.

Gratz Early Childhood Education Courses Approved for PA Director Credential

The [Pennsylvania Keys to Professional Development](#) is an accreditation system aimed at improving the quality of professionals working in early childhood and school-age programs. Under this system, programs are evaluated on a one-to-four star scale, with each star correlating to particular professional development benchmarks.

In order for an early childhood center to earn more than a two-star rating, at least one member of the center's staff must have earned the Pennsylvania Director's Credential. Gratz has recently been approved to offer coursework that would qualify students for this important credential. After taking the three approved Gratz courses - one in program administration for young children, one in program supervision for young children and one on creating a business plan for an early childhood center - students can apply for their Pennsylvania Director's Credential certificate.
