

Leadership and Anxiety in the Church: A Family Systems Perspective

Who Will Benefit:

- Pastors, Church Council / Vestry / Session members, Pastor-Parish Committees, Personnel Committees and judicatory leaders of all denominations.
- The workshop would be especially helpful if a team made up of clergy, staff, and lay leadership from a congregation would attend the event together.



Workshop Format:

It will be conducted online via Zoom video conferencing. Registrants will attend on their computer. Zoom offers opportunity for participants to interact in break-out sessions. People from the same church will be placed in the same break-out group, so they can discuss how to apply the learnings to their church. Registrants will be expected to have a device with both a camera and a microphone to fully participate. A Zoom link will be sent to all registrants two days before the event begins. A manual will be shipped to each registrant's street address prior to the event.

Workshop Leader:

Rev. Richard Blackburn is LMPC Director Emeritus and Senior Consultant. He participated in Dr. Edwin Friedman's *Post Graduate Clergy Seminar in Family Emotional Process* and the Georgetown Family Center's *Post Graduate Program in Bowen Family Systems Theory and Its Applications*.

Registration Fee:

The early-bird fee is **\$109.00** for those who register before the preregistration deadline. Those deadlines are:

- August 6 for the August 19, 2020 workshop.
- September 11 for the September 24, 2020 workshop.
- November 20 for the December 3, 2020 workshop.

After those dates the fee is **\$139.00**. Cancellations are subject to a nonrefundable administration fee of \$25.00, if LMPC receives notice of cancellation by the preregistration deadline. Afterward there will be no refund for cancellations, since the manuals will have already been shipped to registrants. About the Workshop:

Since the publication of Dr. Edwin Friedman's *Generation to Generation*, many pastors and other church leaders have become aware of Bowen family systems theory as a way of understanding congregational dynamics. Family systems theory identifies differentiation of self and anxiety as two key variables impacting human functioning. The seminar on *Leadership and Anxiety in the Church* looks at the challenge presented by the rising levels of anxiety being experienced in churches today, as well as the role that self-differentiated leadership can play in calming such anxiety.

The seminar is comprised of a series of PowerPoint presentations originally conceived for LMPC's *Advanced Clergy Clinic in Family Emotional Process*. Works of art illustrating biblical themes from the Medieval, Renaissance, Baroque, and Modern eras are integrated at various points to facilitate theological reflection on the themes being presented.

The seminar on *Leadership and Anxiety in the Church* is being offered by Lombard Mennonite Peace Center as part of its ongoing mission to help Christ's church grow in health and wholeness, into all that God wants it to be.
