Zdenka Griswold

Few members have contributed as much to our Club as Zdenka Griswold, who passed away calmly and comfortably on Sunday at home in Portland, Maine.

Zdenka became an Associate Member in June 2009, qualifying for full membership two years later with a passage from the Galapagos to Marquesas with her husband Jack aboard their cutter-rigged Valiant 42, Kite. They were appointed Roving Rear Commodores in 2014, and during the course of their seven-year circumnavigation proposed many new members from a variety of countries.



On returning home to Maine in 2016 she and Jack were appointed joint Port Officers for Portland, a post they held until 2018. Even so, they still found time for a cruise most years, covering the eastern seaboard of North America from Newfoundland to the Caribbean.

In 2017 Zdenka joined the General Committee, and was elected a Rear Commodore two years later. Somewhat reluctantly she agreed to become Chair of the Publications Sub-Committee, where the editors of Flying Fish and Newsletter considered her the perfect 'boss', never interfering but always ready with constructive advice if asked. Having co-edited the Cruising Club of America's journal Voyages for five years this advice was based on practical experience.

In 2019 she was also appointed Chair of the OCC Governance Committee, which is tasked with the running of the Club including overseeing the actions of the Board/Directors. Then in 2021, at a time when many clubs were shrinking in the wake of Covid, Zdenka took on the Membership brief. Numbers increased by 11% during her three years in post.

Zdenka invariably saw the bigger picture, and when standing for Vice Commodore in April 2024 wrote:

The world is never still. Climate change, a pandemic, natural and man-made disasters inform blue water cruising plans worldwide. These challenges are balanced by unsurpassed opportunities to visit beautiful and often isolated places, learn from local people and cultures, and slowly and sustainably explore far and wide. The OCC works hard to provide support, guidance and inspiration, striving to do so most effectively under each unique set of circumstances.

Sadly Zdenka was forced to resign her OCC responsibilities last August following a devastating medical diagnosis which, with Jack by her side, she faced with great courage. She truly was one in a million – kind, wise, intelligent, funny and totally loyal. The OCC Award which she received this year, for 'valuable service to the OCC', could not have been more richly deserved.

2025 Annual General Meeting

This was followed by an overview of the Club's activities over the course of the past year. It was a busy year for the OCC with a huge number of gatherings organised all around the world to celebrate the Platinum Anniversary of the Club's founding. Showing slides of collages of photographs from a selection of OCC 70th Anniversary events Fi announced the release of the OCC 2024 70th Anniversary Souvenir Report which was emailed to the Membership to coincide with the AGM.

Mini Globe Race Update: Jasmine Harrison's Progress

Our intrepid member Jasmine Harrison continues her incredible adventure in the Mini Globe Race (MGR), sailing her 5.80m plywood boat *Numbatou*. Already a double world record holder (rowing and swimming) and still under 25, Jasmine is currently tackling the second leg of the race from Panama to Fiji. After facing light winds, adverse currents, and tropical storms early on, she is now making steady progress past the Galápagos towards the Marquesas Islands, where an 8-day stop is scheduled. The full leg stretches over 7,200 miles, with stops at the Marquesas, Tahiti, Tonga, and a finish in Fiji at Vuda Marina.

The MGR will continue with further legs across the Pacific and Indian Oceans, before the fleet returns to Antigua by March 2026.

Tracker (Mini Globe Race), her regular Instagram posts, her Facebook page, and detailed video updates from Race Director Don McIntyre on YouTube.


Ella in The Arctic

Ella Hibbert is embarking on a record-setting, never been done before, solo Arctic Circumnavigation. Her mission is to raise awareness of the rapidity at which we are destroying the Arctic, endangering not only the animals and inhabitants of the Northern-most reaches of our globe, but also highlighting the devastating worldwide impact this is having. Ella had planned to complete this voyage in 2024, however she faced multiple issues, including having to climb the rig at sea alone, total steerage failure in the middle of the Barents

Sea headed for Svalbard, strong winds and up to 5m high waves, and flooding of the yacht; she pushed through these issues and arrived at the world's most northern settlement, Longyearbyen, Svalbard, in August 2024. 


Western Australian Cruising Guide Version 5.5

It is with regret that we report the death of:

Jill Vasey of Tarrant Rushton, Dorset, UK at the age of 92. Jill joined the OCC in 1985, citing the 2575 miles from Gran Canaria to Antigua crewing for her husband Tony aboard their 39ft *Sea Boot* seven years previously as her qualifying passage. On returning to Europe they spent several years in the Med before returning to the UK in 1980. Later in the 1980s they bought *Shaint*, a Rival 41, and made a classic Atlantic circuit followed by several seasons in the Baltic – see Flying Fish 1992/2 and 1993/1. Tony rose through the OCC ranks to become Commodore from 1994 to 1998, but they still found time to explore Maine, New Jersey and the Chesapeake aboard *Clara*, their

24ft Cornish Crabber – see Flying Fish 1997/1 and 1998/1. In latter years they took their 46ft Dutch barge *Penelope's Ark* through the lakes and canals of North Germany, France and Belgium, also keeping a 19ft Drascombe Lugger named *Bumble* for home waters sailing. While he was Commodore Tony commissioned the distinctive Commodore's Lady's Brooch for Jill to wear, since worn with pride by Past Commodore Anne Hammick and currently by Commodore Fi Jones. From the early 1980s onwards Tony and Jill held memorable OCC parties at their home on the banks of Cornwall's Helford River, a tradition continued after their move to Dorset where they converted a vast, empty barn into a lovely home and unique party venue. There will be a memorial service for Jill on 24th May 2025 at St Mary's Church, Tarrant Rushton, Dorset – please contact Clare Vasey ((+44) 07990 610985; clare@grillons.com) for details if you hope to attend.

Mike Honsey of West Yorks, UK. Mike joined the OCC in 2001, following a 1350 mile passage from Conwy in north Wales to Horta in the Azores aboard his 24ft *Quivera*. Ten years later he and his wife Trish left for an Atlantic circuit in *Quivira II*, a Rustler 42, spending time in Galicia and the Caribbean islands before returning to the UK.


