

ENDOWMENT UPDATE

TAPL Members,

After a very busy and extremely exciting start to the TAPL year, the SEA would like to give all members a brief update on the TAPL Scholarship Endowment Funds at the University of Tulsa and the University of Oklahoma, as well as some exciting new updates regarding this committee. As seen above, the Scholarship, Endowments, and Awards Committee (SEA) is now the Scholarship, Endowments, Awards, and Mentoring Committee (SEAM) after the TAPL Board recently approved the consolidation of SEA and the University of Tulsa Mentoring program. Andy Matson will be the Committee Chairman, while Dustin Cates will continue to lead the Mentoring program. SEAM is extremely excited about this consolidation and feel this will allow TAPL to have an even greater impact on our community's future land professionals and local Energy Management programs. Next, the SEAM Committee would like to give all TAPL members an update on the current status of the Endowment Funds for the University of Oklahoma and University of Tulsa. With the challenging times the industry currently finds itself in, the SEAM Committee, alongside the TAPL board, have decided to cut back on fundraising efforts for the Endowment Funds. With that being said, the SEAM Committee is extremely appreciative of our chapter's generous and continuous giving and charitable nature throughout the years, including this past year. As of now, TAPL has raised nearly_\$248,025.00! While this is still short of our original goal of \$280,000.00, this amount raised will still help TAPL provide scholarships to our community's future land professionals, while significantly lowering the burden on the TAPL Annual Budget for years to come. As mentioned above, none of this would be possible without our membership's generous contributions, especially over the past year.

With that being said, there are still ways to donate to the Endowment Funds. One such way is through the TAPL Century Club, which has been established in efforts to recognize and honor those loyal, longtime TAPL members. ASK THE ATTORNEY

ASK THE ATTORNEY

Welcome to "Ask the Attorney." This new monthly segment will provide TAPL members an opportunity to get their energy related legal questions answered--without that hefty legal bill. Whether you have a unique title issue or just a general energy law question, this segment will provide you guidance. Each month I will select one submitted inquiry and provide an analysis.

QUESTION:

In Texas, is a non-payment of a shut-in royalty grounds for a lease cancellation? What effect, if any, do late or partial payments have on a Lessor's ability to cancel a lease?

ANSWER:

It is important to clarify upfront that as with most oil and gas lease issues, the specific lease provisions will guide a specific analysis. However, historically speaking, under Texas law a non-payment of a shut-in royalty can result in a lease termination. Texas requires actual production to satisfy the leases habendum clause, and the payment of shut-ins is a substitution for actual production. Thus, in Texas, a failure to make a proper and timely payment of shut-in's is equivalent to cessation of production, and the lease automatically terminates.

This is contrary to Oklahoma law which only requires the capability of production, and therefore payments of shut-ins are not needed to satisfy the habendum clause. As such, in Oklahoma, as long as there is a capability of production, the failure or improper payment of shut-ins would likely result in an award of damages, not a lease termination.

As to the question of what effect, if any, late or partial payments may have on the Lessor's ability to cancel a lease, Texas courts strictly construe shut-in royalty clauses, and therefore have consistently held that any improper payment is rigidly applied against the Lessee and results in automatic termination of the lease. Thus, barring any negligence or deception on the part of the Lessor, Texas Courts would treat any partial and/or late payment as a full breach.

This rigid enforcement of shut-in payment provisions requires Texas operators to be cautious but also proactive when using or modifying lease forms. Now more than ever, when drafting new leases, a Lessee should always try to protect itself by implementing language that clearly defines how and when a lease can be shut-in (i.e. lack of market or market decline), and the corresponding remedies for improper shut-in payment (i.e. written notice by Lessor, money damages only etc.).

The AAPL Quarterly Board Meeting was supposed to be held in Acme, Michigan but due to restrictions from Covid-19 AAPL decided to hold the Board Meeting virtually. Financials

As the negative impacts continue from Covid-19, AAPL believes we will experience a significant downturn that may last up to two years. In fact, AAPL is anticipating a loss between \$1.4 and \$4 million for this fiscal year. Fortunately, saving and investing over many years have allowed us to weather these difficult times. No plans to cut any benefits to the members. The following are accounts associated with the AAPL and the dollar amounts as of 6/30/20:

- Total Assets = \$38,682,950 (down from \$40,110,013 as of 6/30/19)
- AAPL, Inc's Investment Accounts = \$30,999,467 (up from \$30,044,461 as of 6/30/19)
- AAPL Educational Foundation, Inc. = \$4,331,244 (down from \$4,394,565 as of 6/30/19)
- Landman Scholarship Trust = \$7,770,990 (down from \$7,811,987 as of 6/30/19)
 - Landman Scholarship Trust gave out 39 scholarships last fiscal year totally \$196,000.
