**International Mother Language Day** (IMLD) is a worldwide annual observance held on 21 February to promote awareness of linguistic and cultural diversity and multilingualism. First announced by **UNESCO** on 17 November 1999, it was formally recognised by the United Nations General Assembly in its resolution establishing 2008 as the International Year of Languages. It was inspired by the Bangladeshis (“language martyrs”) who died during a protest at the University of Dhaka on February 21, 1952, when they defended Bengali as a state language for Bangladesh. The people celebrate International Mother Language Day by laying down flowers to the Martyrs’ Monument and replications of that monument.

The Maynamati T.S. Lodge and TOS Group submitted their cordial respect to the language martyrs by offering flowers to the Central Shahid Minar of Comilla. Members present included: Sree Haripada Debnath, Mr Omar Faruque, Kalipada Debnath, Md. Asikur Rahman.
