

# PSAT Registration Information

- Sunny Hills is offering the PSAT exam on **Wednesday, October 13, 2021.**
- **PSAT 11 sales will be September 20 - September 24**
  - Space is limited, purchase exam EARLY!
- Cost: \$20.00
- Exam will only be sold through the *Sunny Hills Webstore* (student must create an webstore account to purchase the exam)

*Some additional information regarding the PSAT:*

COVID-19 has impacted many aspects of education. Over the last year and a half, there have been significant changes announced to 4-year college admission exam requirements (SAT/ACT). The Sunny Hills Counseling Department wants to make sure all students are fully informed before deciding whether or not to register for the PSAT/NMSQT at Sunny Hills High School, which will be given on Wednesday, October 13, 2021. The PSAT is **optional** and only recommended if the SAT is needed or recommended for the student's specific post-high school plans. Students and families should review the most updated admission requirements to decide if taking the PSAT is something that fits their academic goals. The College Board provides 2 free practice PSAT tests that students may use for PSAT/SAT preparation as well. If students have concerns about PSAT testing in a traditional paper and pencil testing environment under the COVID-19 circumstances, these practice tests can be a good resource for SAT preparation. 1. The University of California (UC) system of schools will **NOT** consider SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions decisions or awarding scholarships. [UC Exam Information](#)
2. The California State University (CSU) system of schools has **temporarily suspended** the SAT or ACT test requirements only for students applying for admission in Fall 2022 as Freshmen. [CSU Exam Information](#)
3. For private colleges/universities and out-of-state public schools, please check the school's website to verify, as most schools have moved to a testing optional policy.
