CPR TRAINING TWO-PART PROCESS

CPR Society conducts CPR Training in a two-part format, which includes an online training and an in-person “hands-on” training component. There is no fee for Caregivers and DFS Staff.

Part 1: Online CPR Training

- The online CPR video training must be completed prior to attending Part 2 of the CPR Training. A Spanish edition of online CPR Training is available upon request by calling or texting CPR Society at (888) 860-3031.
- Upon completion of the website registration, the participant will be emailed the course materials and online training video(s) to review before taking the Part 2 in-person session
- The participant will receive their CPR Society Course Voucher from the designated Resource Development and Support Unit Staff
- The CPR Society Course Voucher contains pertinent registration information, including the CPR Training registration link
- The CPR Society Course Voucher is only permitted for use by authorized DFS Staff and Caregivers. A photo ID will be required at the office

CAR SEAT TRAINING TWO-PART PROCESS



Buckle Up Every Age, Every Seat, Every Trip

Car Seat Training is conducted in a two-part process, which includes completing an Online Training Session (Part 1) and an in-person Car Seat Installation Session (Part 2).

Part 1: Online Training

The online “Child Passenger Safety Training” is located on the “QPI Just in Time Training Website”.

The Part 1 online training must be completed, prior to registering for Part 2 of the training. Upon the completion of the online training, an online quiz will be generated which requires a score of 80% or higher to pass.

RESPITE & CHILD CARE

The Foster Kinship Respite care program has become more than just an opportunity for our caregivers to take some time for themselves. Children have opportunities to socialize in a safe environment. We preserve family in the home, at times when caregivers have become overwhelmed or frustrated. Our trauma-informed childcare team provides free respite care, social groups, and school-break camps for up to four hours at a time.

We also provide free childcare during required caregiver classes in order to eliminate barriers to kinship licensing and support the needs of each family individually.

For families who have concerns about the behavior of the child in their home, we offer free consultations with our behavioral specialists who assist in identifying resources in the community based on the child needs, as well as training on trauma-informed parenting techniques.

We also provide community support and navigational resources for children with Autism and FASD. This would include support toward locating clinic interventions, assessments and diagnostics, listings of ABA providers, and connecting families with programs for case management, along with information on local family support groups.

BEHAVIORAL CONSULTATIONS

YOUTH SUPPORT GROUPS

Through social groups and structured activities, we discuss coping mechanisms, critical thinking skills, problem-solving through language, and communication.

Groups are facilitated by young adult professionals who have spent time in kinship and/or foster care as children, enabling trust between the group and inspiring youth in difficult places to see what is possible.

Groups are free and serve children aged 12-18.

The Navigator Program is a starting point for anyone who has questions about parenting a relative's child in Nevada. Kinship families may call during our open office hours to consult on questions relating to kinship care in Nevada including, kinship foster care, guardianship, child-only TANF, resources, and more. Professional family advocates staff the offices and phones.

Each service is designed to connect kinship families to networks of social support, provide basic needs, and increase baseline resources by ensuring understanding of and access to available help.

Support groups are a safe place to discuss the joys and challenges of raising a relative's child where You can laugh, cry, and lean on and learn from others who are walking in your shoes. Support groups also include sharing of best practices and resources for kinship caregivers. Our groups are confidential and non-judgmental.

Groups are offered five times a month with online and Spanish options available. Some groups include meals and childcare. Groups provide an hour of relicensing training credit for licensed foster kinship caregivers.

CASE
MANAGEMENT

Foster Kinship's Case Management Program is a comprehensive support program for kinship caregivers in Nevada designed to increase the stability and well-being of the kinship family.

Our kinship resource center has limited emergency resources such as diapers/wipes, car seats, clothing, books, toys, and formula.

Our program accepts clients on an ongoing basis. Each qualified family receives a customized case plan with community referrals, assistance with child-only TANF and guardianship applications, transportation, some financial assistance, and access to the kinship resource center.



Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) is designed to provide caregivers the skills to become more willing, ready, and able to help persons at risk of suicide. In this 2-day work shop, we will provide you the tools to intervene with someone with thoughts of suicide. You will learn to be Alert, how to Assess the Risk and develop a safe plan.

Why should I come to safeTALK (Suicide Alertness for Everyone)?

In only 3.5 hours, you will learn how to provide practical help to persons with thoughts of suicide. Expect to leave safeTALK more willing and able to perform an important Suicide Alert helping role for persons with thoughts of suicide.

Youth Mental Health First Aid

In this one-day course you will learn.....

The risk factors and warning signs of a variety of mental health challenges common among adolescents, including anxiety, depression, psychosis, eating disorders, AD/HD, disruptive behavior disorders, and substance use disorder.





Trust-Based Relational Intervention® at Raise the Future

is an evidence-based parenting and intervention model developed by Dr. Karyn Purvis and Dr. David Cross at the Karyn Purvis Institute of Child Development at Texas Christian University.

Trust-based Relational Intervention® (TBRI®) is an attachment-based, trauma-informed intervention that is designed to meet the complex needs of vulnerable children.



This family-based intervention is designed for children who have experienced relationship-based traumas such as institutionalization, multiple foster placements, maltreatment, abuse, and/or neglect.

Families caring for children from hard places often experience challenges addressing the resulting behaviors and understanding the complex needs of their children.

Raise the Future is here to help! Our Family Support Services Program provides TBRI® Caregiver training for *Adoptive, Kinship, Reunified Biological Families and Foster Families*.

TBRI® classes count toward Foster Relicensing hours.

TBRI® classes are approved for up to 24 Continuing Education Units for Nevada Social Work Board.

In partnership with the Clark County Department of Family Services,
the classes are free to all Clark County, Nevada residents.

*By pre-registering for a diaper bundle, the registrant is certifying that:

1. They are either the head of household, parent of a child, relative caregiver, or fictive kin in the active TANF household -OR- the authorized representative as documented on the TANF case; and
2. Those pre-registered are an active TANF child recipient between the ages of 0-5, or a TANF recipient at least six months pregnant on the active TANF case; and
3. Have not received and agree they will not accept more than one PEAF diaper bundle per eligible child or unborn child of the pregnant mother; and
4. Understand that pre-registering does not confirm eligibility for the diaper bundle. Eligibility will be verified between the Agency (Subrecipient) and the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services (Division). The pre-registrant will be notified of the final eligibility determination and location of pickup if applicable.
5. By submitting the pre-registration form, the registrant is giving express consent for the Agency (Subrecipient) to share all information provided with the Nevada Division of Welfare and Supportive Services (Subrecipient) for the purposes of verifying eligibility to receive a PEAF diaper bundle and for coordination of services

The Nevada Registry is a statewide system of career development and recognition created to acknowledge the dedicated professionals who work with Nevada's children. **The Nevada Registry** aims to support careers in Early Care and Education by validating the professional achievements of those working in the field and is one of the statewide efforts geared toward reducing staff turnover, increasing wages, heightening professionalism and increasing advancement opportunities for ECE practitioners. Serving as a clearinghouse of information for the field of ECE, **The Nevada Registry** offers Career Ladder placement, an **online calendar of training**, community resources/information and a statewide job board. **The Nevada Registry** is also responsible for the approval of all informal (not-for-college-credit) child care training in the state."
