Foster parents are required to complete 12 hours of training annually.

Foster parents that will be having their first annual inspection, since their licensure, are to complete the following four (4) trainings found on the QPI website www.qpinevada.org:

- The Development Web: A Perspective on Learning and Behavior Problems
- Effective Discipline in Developmental Stages
- Trauma and the Impact on Children in Foster Care Part 1 and Part 2

Foster parents that have completed these required trainings in previous years, must complete 12 hours of specific classes within their license parameter. For example, if you are licensed for teenagers, please choose trainings relating to parenting teens. Your licensing representative may also recommend specific classes pertaining to your family's needs.

New Federal guidelines require all foster parents to update the "Emergency Preparedness" form annually, which includes an in state and out of state emergency contact.

Pediatric CPR and Car Seat Safety Training are also required to be completed in person by all foster parents. CPR is required to be completed every other year and Car Seat Safety Training is required to be completed every 3 years. Training dates can be viewed on the QPI website www.qpinevada.org


