Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) is designed to provide caregivers the skills to become more willing, ready, and able to help persons at risk of suicide. In this 2-day work shop, we will provide you the tools to intervene with someone with thoughts of suicide. You will learn to be Alert, how to Assess the Risk and develop a safe plan.

Why should I come to safeTALK (Suicide Alertness for Everyone)?

In only 3.5 hours, you will learn how to provide practical help to persons with thoughts of suicide. Expect to leave safeTALK more willing and able to perform an important Suicide Alert helping role for persons with thoughts of suicide.

Youth Mental Health First Aid

In this one-day course you will learn.....

The risk factors and warning signs of a variety of mental health challenges common among adolescents, including anxiety, depression, psychosis, eating disorders, ADHD, disruptive behavior disorders, and substance use disorder.

The NCAC's National Training Center (NTC) offers a wide range of online training opportunities for child abuse professionals. The NTC's online training includes live and archived Webinars and Ask the Expert sessions, and our recorded Online Training Courses (available at no charge).

Free! Online Training courses are recorded training sessions synched with a PowerPoint Presentation. With 30 courses to choose from, these sessions feature some of the most respected names in the field as its faculty. These online training courses range in length from 1 hour to 3 1/2 hours.

Free! Webinars – The NTC offers live webinars on child maltreatment topics created and presented by subject matter experts. Each webinar includes a question and answer period at the end of the presentation. Webinars feature topics that support the adoption of evidence-based practices. Sessions last about one hour. Live webinars are recorded and archived on our website so anyone can access them later at their convenience.

Free! Ask the Expert – Our Ask the Expert sessions allows participants to submit questions in advance to top experts in the field. An extended question and answer period is also included, allowing discussion of important current issues with experienced child maltreatment professionals. Sessions last about one hour. Live Ask the Expert sessions are recorded and archived on our website so anyone can access them later at their convenience.

The Nevada Registry aims to support careers in Early Care and Education by validating the professional achievements of those working in the field and is one of the statewide efforts geared toward reducing staff turnover, increasing wages, heightening professionalism and increasing advancement opportunities for ECE practitioners. Serving as a clearinghouse of information for the field of ECE, The Nevada Registry offers Career Ladder placement, an online calendar of training, community resources/information and a statewide job board. The Nevada Registry is also responsible for the approval of all informal (not-for-college-credit) child care training in the state."

The Nevada Registry approves many of the training classes offered by the DFS Training Team. Approved trainings provided by other local agencies/groups are posted on the website, such as Pediatric CPR classes, Sign Language, Art, and other topics.


Car Seat Safety Trainings
