THE APOSTLES CREED (said together)

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord; He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church*, the Communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

**The phrase "holy catholic Church" means the Church worldwide.*

PRAYERS OF GOD'S PEOPLE

Leader: In joyful expectation of his glorious return, we pray: Lord Jesus, come to your Church as Lord and judge, and lead us to live in readiness for our redemption.

People: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

Leader: Come to your world as King of the nations; guide those in power to lead with righteousness and truth, and rebuke those whose leadership is harmful or unjust.

People: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

Leader: Come as the good shepherd, that people from this city and every city of the world will be saved and find life in you. We pray especially for the work of Bethlehem Bible College, that they would train students to live and minister as witnesses to Christ's love among their Palestinian and Israeli neighbors.

People: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

Leader: Come as Savior and comforter to all who suffer and struggle with illness, addiction, loneliness or distress; set us free to serve you.

People: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

Leader: Come from heaven, Lord Jesus, with power and great glory. Lift us up to meet you, that with all your saints and angels we may live and reign with you in your new creation.

People: Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.

Leader: Lord Jesus, hear the prayers of your people. I invite you to lift up your prayers and needs, either silently or out loud. If aloud, please speak clearly for all to hear so that we might agree with you in prayer.

Leader: Almighty and everlasting God, whose will it is to restore all things in your well-beloved Son, the King of kings and Lord of lords:

People: Mercifully grant that the peoples of the earth, divided and enslaved by sin, may be freed and brought together under his most gracious rule; who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Leader: Let us confess our sins to Almighty God.

CONFESSION OF SIN (said together)

Heavenly Father, we confess that we have obstructed the way for your Son's coming in our lives. We have lived for our own desires and interests, rather than seeking first your Kingdom and your righteousness. By the power of your Holy Spirit, prepare the way for your coming in our hearts. Straighten our crooked ways. Flatten the mountainous greed within us. Fill in the valleys of our unrighteous thoughts. Smooth out the roughness of our speech; so that all mankind may see your salvation, through Jesus Christ, the light who has come into the world. Amen.

*Many people kneel during the **Confession of Sin** as a sign of humility and repentance before God. Confession and repentance are the means God gives us for receiving the forgiveness made possible through Jesus Christ.*

Leader: May almighty God, who sent his son into the world to save sinners, bring you his pardon and peace, now and forever. Amen.

*During the **Absolution** the priest declares God's forgiveness as promised in the Bible for all who confess and turn away from their sins. (1 John 1:9)*

Leader: The peace of the Lord be always with you;
People: And also with you.

*The **Peace** reminds us that we must reconcile with one another before we receive Holy Communion (Matthew 5:23). "Peace be with you" or "God's peace" are some of the phrases used as we greet one another.*

HOLY COMMUNION

*We welcome all baptized Christians who are willing to repent of their sin and trust in Jesus Christ for salvation to receive Holy Communion. If this is not authentic for you to receive you may remain seated or come forward and fold your arms across your chest and we will pray a blessing over you. It is our custom to use wine during communion. **If you prefer, you may receive grape juice** from the smaller chalices on the end of the serving lines.*

Leader: The Lord be with you.

People: We lift them up to the Lord!

Leader: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Leader continues in Eucharistic Prayer.

People: Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.
