



This Community Health Evangelism "Train the Trainer" is offered through Global Partners Health Network www.globalpartneronline.org/gphn and Village Health International. It will be hosted at Kentwood Community Church, 1200 60th St SE, Kentwood Michigan. Price: \$200.00 per person.

Attendees of the March 2019 Train-the-Trainer CHE Training at Kentwood Community Church in Kentwood, Michigan, will be equipped to become certified CHE trainers. They will be qualified to survey and choose locations to implement CHE strategies.

CHE curriculum now includes more than 11,000 lessons on a variety of topics including:

- water, sanitation and hygiene
- agriculture and animal husbandry
- evangelism and discipleship
- economic development and leadership
- marriage and family
- HIV/AIDS and disabilities

Those trained in CHE will learn effective teaching methods so they can prepare local trainers to teach in local communities, both rural and urban. They connect with unreached people from diverse religious and worldview backgrounds.
