The need is for walking shoes even though most of these people will be heading out in a few days to a sponsor. Usually they travel by plane, but also trains and buses. They stay here in a motel for a few days to get checked for COVID and to make travel arrangements that are typically paid for by their family or friends who are sponsoring them. Each gets a new set of clothes and shoes if available.

Especially needed are men's sizes 7-9, women's sizes 5-9 and children's shoes of all sizes. Don't break the bank. Discount and big box stores are OK. New or slightly used only, please.

It's one small thing a person can do about the chaos in our world right now. Please drop them in the rainbow-colored box near the east door to St. Mark's. Someone will gather them up and take them to Second Presbyterian Church's clothing bank for asylum seekers.
