

ABOUT THE JANE LLOYD FUND

The Jane Lloyd Fund was established at the Berkshire Taconic Foundation in 2006 to benefit cancer patients and their families with financial need in the Connecticut towns of Canaan, Cornwall, Falls Village, Kent, Salisbury and Sharon.

The Jane Lloyd Fund supports the patients' day-to-day living expenses. Such support may include the costs of transportation, housing, food, utilities and other expenses that will help the patient heal in a supportive environment or depart this life comfortably with friends and family.

Disbursements from the fund are made upon the written recommendation of a social service agent, town social worker, hospice care provider, visiting nurse, counselor, or pastor and the funds will go directly to the vendor or provider of the service.

ABOUT JANE LLOYD

Jane Lloyd was a life-long resident of Lakeville, CT diagnosed with breast cancer at the age 36. The Fund was founded in 2006 by Jane Lloyd's family shortly after Janes' valiant struggle with the disease ended. Her family wanted to respond to the generosity of the community who helped Jane when she was in need so that others in the community might experience the same sense of well-being in their own time of great sadness and need.

Jane underwent surgery, radiation and chemotherapy after her diagnosis in 1997 but continued her successful gardening business until 2004 when a relapse limited her ability to work full time. The community and her family supported her by paying for her mortgage, utilities and other expenses so that she could stay in her house in Lime Rock as long as possible.
