Welcome to the 2022 Florida Conference Red Zone Weekend.

Please make sure to read the entire document regarding Camping / Housing before arriving to Camp Kulaqua.

At the Red Zone Weekend your Pathfinders/Adventurers will enjoy worship services beginning Friday night. Each service will include our FL talented Pathfinders/Adventurers, guest speaker, inspirational praise, and worship. Also, they will enjoy camp activities, honors, bug races, drill team & drums corps competitions, pin trading, fun / learning activities and more. This is a great opportunity to meet and make new friends within a Christian and natural environment. YOU do not want to miss this years' Red Zone Weekend.

RED ZONE IS FOR PATHFINDER/ADVENTURER CLUBS – DIRECTORS & STAFF MEMBERS

Everyone that registers for the Florida Conference Red Zone Weekend must be part of a Pathfinder/Adventurer Club or serve as an Officially Appointed Volunteer for the Conference Office.

Parents who attend should be staff members of a Pathfinder/Adventurer Club and ALL adults (18+) must have completed the Sterling Volunteers requirements. [Formerly Verified Volunteers]

ARRIVAL / REGISTRATION PROCESS

Check In will begin at 2:00 pm Friday afternoon May 27, 2022.

Please plan to arrive Friday and check in between: 2:00 – 7:00 pm.

As you approach the Gate / Security Tent at Camp Kulaqua, you will be greeted by our friendly Security Staff.

For those Clubs that are camping, please plan to have your camping areas set up before Sabbath begins.

Your Club Director or a designated person needs to report to the "A Frame" Building to check in your Club.

After Checking In ... an Officially Appointed Volunteer (OAV) from the Conference will escort the Club to the camp site. After the Pathfinders/Adventurers, staff & equipment are dropped off at your campsite; ALL vehicles need to be moved to the Long-Term parking area as soon as possible. Please plan on 20 minutes maximum to unload and remove your vehicle.

Please keep streets clear at all times.

Do Not Park in the streets, park inside your camping area to unload. Each Club will receive ONE Parking Permit for ONE Vehicle. ONLY the vehicle with the Permit will be allowed to stay in your camping area during the weekend. The Parking Permit needs to be placed on the dashboard and visible from the outside.

Please make a special effort to arrive early. No Vehicles will be allowed to enter Camp after 11:00 pm on Friday.

EARLY ARRIVALS

Clubs should not plan to arrive at Camp Kulaqua before Friday, May 27 at 2:00 pm. You will not be allowed to enter. We will not be able to accommodate any early arrivals since we are setting up camp sites for each Club.

CAMPSITES

Camp Kulaqua will offer us plenty of tent camping spaces; Clubs will camp by Areas.

We are allowing 160 square feet (normally it is 120) per registered person in each camp site.

Camp sites will be determined according to the number of Pathfinders/Adventurers and Staff registered for Red Zone.

There will be marked roads designated for foot traffic and utilities services.

Please refer to Red Zone Weekend Schedule for nightly camp site curfew.

One Vehicle per Campsite: this is for a vehicle that is necessary to camping such as chuck wagons, RV's or one motor vehicle that will be used for food storage. The vehicles will remain in the camp site and turned off at all times during the weekend. You can move the vehicle **Sunday morning after 8:30 am.**

Please let us know if your Club has a Chuck Wagon and an Equipment Trailer.

We strongly suggest that your Club bring your own Ant Killer.

No Drums will be allowed to be played from 9:00 pm to 9:00 am in the Campsites.

TRASH

The camp will provide dumpsters that will be set throughout the camping area.

Each club will be expected to place their trash in bags and put the bags in the dumpsters.

When walking around, please find a trash can for all your trash.

In buildings, please find a trash can for all your trash.

In the field, please put your trash in a trash can.

Encourage others to put their trash in trash cans.

Pick up trash that you see around camp and put in a trash can.

GENERATORS

Any kind of Generators need to be OFF at nighttime. No exceptions. Check the Weekend Schedule for ON/OFF times.

Friday night: Generators OFF at 11:00 pm

Saturday morning: Generators ON at 7:00 am

Saturday night: Generators OFF at 11:00 pm

Sunday morning: Generators ON at 7:00 am

CAMPFIRES / SAFETY

Campfires must be in a container up off the ground by at least 4 inches. Usually this can be accomplished with one half of a barrel up on bricks.

NO Fireworks and NO Weapons of any kind and NO Drones will be permitted at the 2022 Red Zone Weekend.

PARKING

There will be two designated areas to park vehicles:

1. Camp sites: this is for ONE vehicle that are necessary to camping such as chuck wagons, RV's or motor vehicle that will be used for food storage. This vehicle will remain in the camp site and turned off at all times during the camporee AND must display the Parking Permit. You can move the vehicle Sunday morning after 8:30 am.
2. Outside the Campsite Parking: These vehicles will be allowed to come and go from the parking lot to anywhere outside Camp Kulaqua at their discretion. **They will not be allowed inside of camp or camp sites until Sunday after 8:30 am.**

If you need to leave Camp Kulaqua before 8:30 am on Sunday, please let us know in advance. There will be a special camping area (separate from your Club) that will be made available to you.

DANGER / WILD ANIMALS

While Camping at Camp Kulaqua be aware of wild animals. These areas are off limits, and they are not camping areas. Never bring food to the camping tents because this might attract wild animals.

NO PETS ALLOWED:

With hundreds of Pathfinders/Adventurers camping closely together, it is required that you leave your pets at home.

If you are bringing a certified service animal, please inform our staff at the A-Frame when you arrive and have documentation to prove that this is a registered service animal.

MEATLESS RED ZONE WEEKEND

We are making this Red Zone Weekend a Meatless Event. Thank you for making this possible. Vegetarian meals only.

CAMP KULAQUA CAFETERIA MEALS

If you purchased meals tickets to eat at Camp Kulaqua Cafeteria the meals times are:

Friday Supper 6:00pm – 7:30pm

Sabbath Breakfast 7:00am – 8:00am

Sabbath Lunch 12:30pm – 1:30pm

Sabbath Supper 6:00pm – 7:00pm

Sunday Breakfast 7:00am – 8:00am

Sunday Lunch 12:30pm – 1:30pm

If you miss the scheduled mealtime, you missed the meal; there are no refunds or exchanges. Meal Tickets cannot be swapped for another mealtime if a meal is missed. All meal tickets will be picked up at the Camp Kulaqua Main Office near the King Chapel AND will be required to enter the cafeteria for the meal.

ITEMS TO BRING

Be prepared for Rain, Sunshine, Insects and Hot weather. Bring your poncho, hat, sun block and insect repellent.

Be sure to bring lots of water to keep everyone hydrated. We strongly suggest that your Club bring their own Ant Killer.

COMMUNICATIONS AND EMERGENCIES

Security, Parking, and Officially Appointed Volunteers will have a two-way radios in case of Emergencies.

Also, a vehicle equipped with sirens / speakers / lights will broadcast any emergency instructions.

In case of a missing camper [constant steady siren] we need to assemble at the baseball diamond/field.

For Weather Emergencies [intermittent siren] we need to take cover inside building / take cover immediately.

Please Do Not Call 911 without first contacting the Camp Office @ Camp Kulaqua by dialing **386 454 1351**.

This is to make sure that the Camp Staff and our Security / Medical teams are aware of the situation and can escort the ambulance to the emergency.

SECURITY

Security will be available 24 hours a day. Security will be wearing a special shirt / vest and will be committed to help us have a safe and happy Red Zone Weekend.

SIRENS

If you hear a continuous siren – it is for a missing child; everyone needs to assemble at the baseball diamond.

If you hear an intermittent siren – it is for weather emergency; take cover in any building immediately.

BICYCLES / ROLLER BLADES / SKATEBOARDS

No bicycles, No Roller Skates/Blades, No Skateboards. If it has wheels – please leave it at home.

They will be confiscated until the last day of the Event.

GOLF CARTS

There will be official Red Zone golf carts. Anyone driving a golf cart MUST have a valid driver's license. The number of passengers per golf cart should be equal to the number of seats. The speed limit on paved roads will be 10 mph maximum and 5 MPH in the camping areas. Only Florida Conference owned golf carts are allowed.

Non-Camp issued personal golf carts, scooters, mopeds, two-wheel motorcycles, 3-wheelers, ATV are NOT permitted.

Florida Conference has a limited amount of Golf Carts for Rent for Medical Reasons. Medical necessity letter needed.

ELECTRONICS / CELLULAR PHONES

We are requesting that all electronics, including cellular phones will be off or on vibrate during Honors Classes, Activities, Programs, Sabbath Programs, and Presentations.

FLAG RAISING / LOWERING CEREMONY

We want your Club and Pathfinders/Adventurers to attend and participate on this Ceremony every morning and evening. We will be asking for Pathfinders/Adventurers from your Club to be Volunteers to perform at the Ceremony. Check the Red Zone Schedule for times. The US Flag pole is located near the Camp Kulaqua Office.

PARADE ON SUNDAY – To Enter Gym for Closing Ceremony

We will be having a Pathfinder Parade Sunday to lead us to the Pathfinders Award Program. See Schedule for time.

TRADE PINS

Remember to bring your pins for trading. This is a great way to meet other people and make new friends.

SERVICES / MEETINGS

Please be respectful and do not have conversations or leave early; if you do need to talk, please step outside.

During all our services, please wait until we end the program to exit the building.

We ask that all adults/club staff help us by modeling this to our kids and asking them to abide by these guidelines.

MEDICAL/FIRST AID

The Osceola Cabin [near the King Chapel] is the designated building to be the Medical / First Aid headquarters and will be available 24 hours/day. Remember to bring your own Club First Aid Kit for minor incidents in your own campsites. Each club is expected to have, within their staff, a staff member designated to offer first aid.

FIRST AID KIT RECOMMENDATION / MEDICAL CONSENTS

A First Aid Kit well stock with the essentials is indispensable. Quantities of suggested items for your First Aid Kit depend on the size of your group and local conditions. Please make sure to bring all the medical consent forms with you.

If the Pathfinder/Adventurer is not traveling with the Club Director, make sure that a copy of the Medical Consent is in the vehicle when traveling and in the lodging area where the Pathfinder/Adventurer is staying/camping.

Suggested First Aid Kit Contents:

- Liquid hand sanitizer
- Elastic bandages
- Gauze bandages
- Sterile pads
- Triangular bandage
- Assorted gauze pads
- Adhesive cloth tape
- Assorted adhesive strips [band aids]
- Clinical oral thermometer
- Scissors
- Tweezers
- Sunburn lotion
- Burn ointment/spray
- Poison ivy lotion
- Instant ice/heat pack
- Small flashlight [with extra batteries]
- Antibiotic ointment
- Antiseptic wipes
- Non-aspiring pain reliever [pill, capsule and or liquid]
- Sinus/cold medication
- Breathing barrier [CPR]

Non latex gloves
Lip balm or salve
Hydrocortisone ointment
Antacids
Bug bite / sting medication [ointment, ampoules, spray]
Moleskin for blisters
Safety pins
First Aid instruction booklet

Any Pathfinder/Adventurer that takes medication must have a signed letter from the parents / guardian giving permission to the staff member who is assigned the duty of the club first aid for your club. Medication(s) must be in original bottle with the child's name and directions clearly stated. Bring asthma pumps, nebulizers, for anyone who uses them. If an individual is allergic to bees or anything else, they are to bring their epi-pen with them.

VOLUNTEERS Invited over for MEALS

A lot of the Volunteers working at the Camporee are not affiliated with a Club. If your Club would like to sponsor one of them to eat any of your delicious camping meals, just let us know at the A Frame when you Check In. Thanks.

SUNDAY NIGHT CAMPING

Tent Camping ONLY is available for clubs staying Sunday night - \$5 / person

LEAVING THE CAMPOREE PROCESS

A Conference Officially Appointed Volunteer needs to inspect your campsite to make sure the area is nice & clean. We need to leave the campgrounds better than the way we found it. Clubs should move out of their Camp Kulaqua housing by 11:00am and packed up in their tent/camping area by 1:00pm. Please leave your camping area packed up and clean, before going to enjoy the water park.
