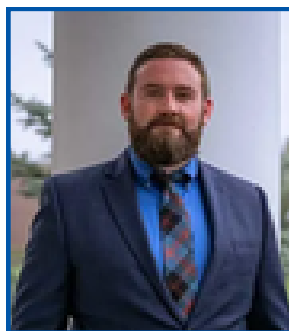

Historian **Craig Gallagher** opens with an overview of the Declaration and the American Revolution, exploring the extraordinary risks taken by the colonies in challenging the British Empire, and later returns to examine how loyal British subjects became Americans under the rallying cry of “No Kings.”

Eric Boyer explores the revolutionary meaning of “No Taxation without Representation” and the development of republican government and political virtue in the new nation.

Turning to the present, **Peter Gunn** considers how the Declaration’s ideals—equality, liberty, consent, and the role of government—continue to shape national debates today.

The course concludes with **David Click**, who examines how early American artists depicted the Revolution and helped create a lasting visual memory of the nation’s founding.
