Nick Baer will share from more than 30 years of research banding migrating birds of prey with the Cape May Raptor Banding Project in Cape May, NJ. To date, the research has provided insight into hawk and eagle migration and distribution patterns, population dynamics, life expectancies and avian diseases amid a changing landscape.

Nick will also share what he and his students have learned about heavy metal bioaccumulation in these apex predators, as well as diseases these birds carry and potentially move during migration.
