Nancy Witcher Langhorne is born in Danville. As **Lady Astor**, she served as the first woman to take her seat as a member of the British Parliament (the second elected), and served from 1919 to 1945. She died in 1964. She is famous for the interaction she had with Winston Churchill in which she said: "Sir, if you were my husband, I'd poison your tea," to which Winston Churchill replied: "Madame, if you were my wife, I'd drink it!"
