Diane Rinaldo

Diane Rinaldo was sworn in as Deputy Assistant Secretary for Communications and Information at the Department of Commerce on April 20, 2018. On May 9, 2019, she became Acting Assistant Secretary for Communications and Information for the Department, and Administrator of the National Telecommunications and Information Administration, the Executive Branch agency principally responsible for advising the President on telecommunications and information policy.



Focusing on cybersecurity and technology policy, Diane has extensive experience in government and the private sector throughout her career. She staffed the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence, where she was the lead committee staffer on Congress' landmark cybersecurity legislation, the Cybersecurity Act of 2015. She also served as the oversight and budget monitor for the National Security Agency and the defense network systems, and served as Deputy Chief of Staff to Congressman Michael Rogers as his top technology policy staffer.

Recognized for her work on cybersecurity, Rinaldo was awarded the Executive Women's Forum's 2016 Influencer of the Year award. She earned a bachelor's degree in Political Science from the University of Maine and an Executive Certificate from the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University for cyber studies.

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Joel Jacobs

Joel Jacobs is Vice President and Chief Information Officer (CIO) of The MITRE Corporation.

He leads the Enterprise Computing, Information, and Security (ECIS) organization, providing comprehensive information technology (IT), knowledge management, enterprise technical computing, cybersecurity, and global security services to enable MITRE staff to effectively serve the company's sponsors.



Under Jacobs' leadership, MITRE has been recognized for its innovative IT practices and for its outstanding work environment for technology professionals. CIO Magazine named MITRE to its CIO 100 list in 2014 and 2018. Computerworld has repeatedly listed MITRE among the country's 100 Best Places to Work in IT (2005–2012, 2016, 2018). The company was a North American Most Admired Knowledge Enterprises (MAKE) award winner four times (2009, 2011, 2015, 2016). InformationWeek named MITRE among the most innovative users of business technology five times (2011–2013, 2016–2017). In 2017, MITRE received the Help Desk Institute's Team Excellence Award for customer service and was named to the Security 500.

In 2018, IDG CIO elected Jacobs to the CIO Hall of Fame, which spotlights IT leaders who have profoundly influenced the IT discipline, the use of technology in business, and the advancement of the CIO role. He also received the Boston CIO Leadership Association's 2018 ORBIE Award as Non-Profit/Public Sector CIO of the Year.

Jacobs was honored as a Computerworld Premier 100 IT Leader in 2011 and as a Boston Business Journal/Mass High Tech CIO of the Year in 2012. In 2015, STEMconnector® named Mr. Jacobs among its 100 CIO/CTO Leaders in STEM in recognition of MITRE's dedication to supporting STEM initiatives. He was also a 2015 Federal Computer Week Federal 100 Award winner.

Jacobs has more than three decades of experience working both at MITRE and in industry on complex IT topics. After joining MITRE in 1981, he held positions with steadily increasing levels of responsibility, managing internal information systems development efforts and directing a variety of network, security, and software engineering and research projects. He served as director of the MITRE Software Center, as department head of Advanced Information Systems Technology, and as a principal investigator in information systems research. From 2003 to 2009, Jacobs was deputy CIO.

In 1996, Jacobs left MITRE to serve as vice president at Concept Five Technologies, a software and professional services company. In 1998, he joined Onsett International Corporation, an IT management consulting firm, as practice director of Technology and Security, and later served as the company's president and CEO. He rejoined MITRE in 2003.

Jacobs holds a bachelor's degree in psychology and natural science from the University of Pennsylvania. In 2004, he completed the Program for Management Development at Harvard Business School.



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Carolyn A. Kirk
Executive Director

Carolyn A. Kirk was selected by the Executive Committee of the Massachusetts Technology Collaborative as the agency's executive director on February 6, 2019, and officially starts her role on February 11, 2019. Kirk previously served as Interim Executive Director by appointment of the Executive Committee on June 18, 2018.

From January 2015 to early February 2019, she served as the Deputy Secretary of the Executive Office of Housing and Economic Development (EOHED), a role she held since the beginning of the Baker-Polito Administration. As Deputy Secretary, Kirk supported the management of HED's \$1.4 billion dollar budget and approximately 1,000 employees. In addition, Kirk's portfolio includes serving alongside Lt. Governor Karyn Polito on the Seaport Economic Council. She is extremely familiar with MassTech's work, having chaired the agency's Board on behalf of EOHED, and has been a leader on the effort to bring broadband to 44 unserved towns, working closely with the Massachusetts Broadband Institute at MassTech.



Prior to her appointment to the Administration, in 2007 Deputy Secretary Kirk became the first woman popularly elected as Mayor of the City of Gloucester, going on to serve three subsequent terms. Her professional career spans more than 25 years and includes time as a management consultant, working with clients that included many of the Top 20 banks in the U.S. along with Fortune 500 companies.

She was raised in Clinton, N.Y., and moved to Massachusetts to attend college, graduating from Boston College in 1984.
