UPDATE ON THE RESTORATION OF THE SAINTS

Michelle Gallinger and her team have been working on four Saints: Saint Thomas, Saint James the Lesser, Saint Simon, and Saint Thaddeus. This phase of the restoration project will see the conclusion of all saints on the West side of the Cathedral.

MEET THE TEAM:

Brittany Houghton is a cultural heritage conservator, specializing in object and archaeological conservation. She has been working on the St. Ninian's wall paintings since 2017. Her most memorable experience was restoring the altar angels in the 2020 season.

Winnie Daley is a paintings conservator from PEI, and has a Master of Art Conservation from Queen's University. She has been working with the conservation team for two years. Her favourite project was restoring the left angel.

Michell Gallinger owner of The Art Gal is a fine arts conservator. She has led the conservation team and the restoration of the Leduc murals for over ten years. Her favourite project was restoring St. Cecilia in 2015, as it kickstarted the restoration of the Saints.

Leigh Philip is a fourth year Arts student at St. Francis Xavier University, originally from Toronto. This is her first summer working on the conservation team as an assistant.



Saint Simon:

Restoration of Saint Simon's original robe. Changes to his robe were made over the years, effectively changing its original light purple colour. Please note the difference in colour when comparing the first and the second picture.

Also, note the difference between the original hands uncovered (bottom picture), and the overpainted hands (top picture).
