We had our first Metanoia meeting last Sunday after the post-Mass social. Those wanting to convert to Catholicism attended alongside their sponsors, as well as confirmed Catholics looking to grow in their knowledge of the faith or reconnect with a Church they'd drifted away from over their lives.

If you missed out on attending last week, fear not! While the first meeting focused on getting to know each other, the 10-week Metanoia series officially begins this week when we cover the first of the sessions. Feel free to join! Each week we will come together to watch a video from the series and to discuss our faith.

What is Metanoia? In the Gospel of Mark, the first words of Jesus are an invitation to metanoia, to repent, to change, to be converted. Each of the 10 episodes explores areas of our life where conversion is so often necessary. Metanoia will examine topics such as who is Jesus, what must we do to inherit eternal life, and many other significant matters of faith.

Don't forget to check out the concerts and dances going on! On Sunday you'll be spoiled for choice, with a free concert called Brent MacLean and Friends being put on after Mass at St. Ninian Place at 1:30pm, and a Ceilidh at the Antigonish Heritage Museum at 2:00pm for \$10.
