DEVELOPMENT & PEACE

The origins of Development & Peace were at the Second Vatican Council (1962-1965). Working closely with their colleagues from Latin America, Africa and Asia, the Canadian bishops became increasingly aware of the massive poverty and man-made injustices that confronted the developing world/Global South. Awakened to the call for justice, the Canadian delegation took an active role in drafting *Gaudium et Spes* (Pastoral Constitution on the Church in the Modern World). In this landmark document, the world's bishops taught that the Church was in solidarity with, and in service to, all humanity. The Church's role in society was to transform social and economic structures to make them more life-giving. Moreover, *Gaudium et Spes* emphasized that individual Catholics had a moral obligation to seek justice for the marginalized and to promote the common good. Serving as the unified voice of the world's bishops, this prophetic document committed the Catholic Church to working for social justice as a core component of its mission.

Funds raised through **Share Lent** would be used exclusively for community development and the promotion of human rights, not preaching or missionary activities. As a result, D&P was to serve **ALL** people regardless of race, creed or ideology. Funds would be granted based on the intrinsic value of the development project, not on religious belief or political orientation. (Jubilee – 50 Years of Solidarity – 'Realizing the Vision')

RESTORATION PROJECT



UPDATE: This week the conservators came to the church after dark to put the paintings under ultraviolet light. They did so in order to see where the over paint on the paintings are, so they don't accidentally remove any of the original! The dark brushstrokes under the ultraviolet light are over paint that they need to be removed.

Two more conservators have joined the project!

For the last month of the restoration, Tirza Harris and Bronwyn Bond will be working together on Saint Andrew! After just three days, the two conservators have already been able to glue St. Andrew down, and reveal some of his columns! Bronwyn Bond is a graduate from Queens University in conservation, and is currently in her final year of receiving a PhD in art history. And Tirza Harris is in her final year of art conservation at Queens University!
