POPE FRANCIS' VISIT TO CANADA

The Holy See has provided further details of the itinerary of Pope Francis' historic visit to Canada, July 24 – 29, 2022. The Holy Father's pilgrimage will focus on Indigenous healing and reconciliation while also providing the shepherd of the world's 1.2 billion Catholics an opportunity to encounter the faithful in Canada. Due to his advanced age and limitations, it is expected that participation by Pope Francis at public events will be limited to approximately one hour.

The visit, drawing on the theme of "Walking Together", will include a combination of public and private events, with an emphasis on Indigenous participation throughout the visit.

RESTORATION PROJECT

The next round of the Restoration Project has started. This will be the sixth consecutive year the Parish has been able to bring in the restoration team. This year, the restorers will finish the remainder three Saints on the East side of the church.



UPDATE: This week the conservators continue the paint removal process. As the restoration moves forward, the restorers have been able to reveal the majority of Saint James the Great's and Saint John's columns! Within the column they have been able to reveal the greenery original to Saint John's and Saint James the Great's images. While Saint James background is marked by the presence of cacti, Saint John was placed amongst flowers! The original Leduc columns that they have been able to reveal from beneath the paint are very well preserved!
