## DEVELOPMENT & PEACE

In 1967, the Canadian bishops launched the Canadian Catholic Organization for Development and Peace as a creative new way to assist the poor and oppressed peoples of the world in their struggle for justice. While originally proposed as a "National Fund to Help Underdeveloped Countries," the Canadian bishops did not want D&P to be just another professional charity that provided material aid and emergency assistance. Their intention was that D&P would serve as the catalyst for a pan-Canadian movement for social justice. To realize this vision, the new organization devoted many of its resources to building an integrated social movement that educated Canadians about global injustice and mobilized them for action. 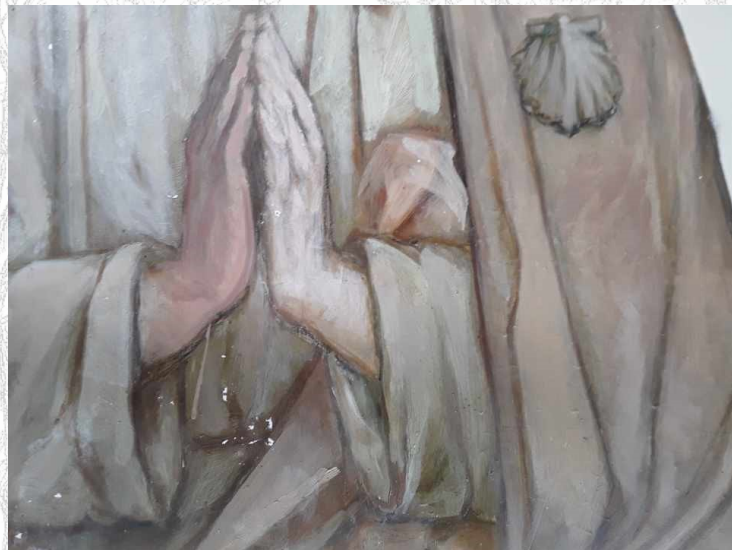

Musique Royale welcomes two musicians from Europe, Birgit Bornauw and Benjamin Macke to perform "Curly Music" part of the 37th Summer Festival.

The repertoire, carefully chosen by Birgit and Benjamin, comes mainly from the Baroque period. The duo will also play tunes from different eras which all have the particularity of "sounding baroque to their ears". Baroque music has many points in common with the traditional music they know well: short melodies and simple structure, significant work on variations, ornamentations, style, and a close relationship to dance.

## RESTORATION PROJEC



**UPDATE:** This week the conservators began cleaning the surface of the paintings. When cleaning the surface of the painting, the conservators are taking off the over paint on the actual figures! This process is different for those sections that have been painted over in yellow, and the actual Saint figures. To remove the over paint from the columns and arches, they use scalpels to scrape off all of the paint. Because the Saint paints are more delicate, however, they clean those with cotton swabs! You can see the difference between the cleaned and uncleaned hand above as the original paintings colours are beginning to surface. On Monday two more conservators will join the team, and begin work on Saint Andrew!
