A small Gloria Dei group picked them up at the airport with Welcome signs and balloons and delivered them safely to their apartment in Wheaton on Thursday, June 20. A Gloria Dei cleaning and set-up crew readied the apartment on Wednesday afternoon and evening, June 19. The family was THRILLED with the apartment and household items. The children especially loved their bedrooms! We also prayed over their new home in Burmese and English and they brought Burmese cookies and candy to share.

Thank you so much for helping us collect the kitchen items. Everything was of such nice quality that I'm sure they will be using and enjoying everything for years to come. We appreciated the partnership. Please pray for this family, particularly in the early weeks, for ease of adjustment and smooth transition. Annual 4th of July Downers Grove Parade Canned Food Drive.

St. Paul's Members traditionally perform a shopping cart drill team routine during the parade for a canned goods and money collection drive. They have invited us to provide whatever support that we can for that parade and collection effort. **All of the canned goods and money collected will be donated to the Downers Grove Fish Food Pantry (FISH).**

We can use volunteers to help push carts during the parade, relieve others pushing carts, walk along the crowd to collect the canned goods and also money as many people give dollar donations. We will also have chairs on the trailer for those who just wish to ride, wave and enjoy the parade.

For those who want to join in on July 4th - Here's the schedule:

11:15 Decorating the parade trailer: Come help decorate it in the parking lot of St. Paul's at 5739 Dunham Road Downers Grove, Illinois 60515.

12:00 Noon: Parking and carpooling: Head to St. Paul member Carol Clifford's house at 4932 Highland between Noon and 12:15 and park your cars in her drive. They'll shuttle all those who show up to Downers Grove North High's (DGN) parking lot. Since the parade ends at the corner of Main and Rogers right around the corner from Carol's house – we can help bring the shopping carts back to her house, help unload the food for FISH to pick up, remove the trailer and cart decorations, and retrieve our cars.

12:15 PM: If you don't carpool with us, meet us at Downers Grove North High Parking Lot (DGN) section 4. We will decorate the shopping carts and practice our marching drills before the parade begins. Trust us – the drills are fun and easy. No prior experience in drill marching is needed.

12:45 PM: The parade kicks off and usually ends at Main Street and Rogers, Downers Grove around 2:15PM/2:30 PM.

Got a Red T-Shirt? St. Paul's volunteers are going to wear red t-shirts or tops. If you've one – would be nice to support them and wear it. If not - don't worry about it.

Bring canned food to donate: We'd appreciate for folks who are participating and supporting this effort to please bring some canned food to put in the carts. For those who can't participate in the parade but want to support this effort, we'll have a box in the West Lobby of the church starting this Sunday (June 30th).

August 23rd Joint Church Trivia Night:

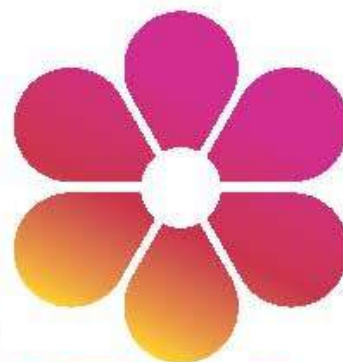

July 2019 Caring for Creation

Once again the Landscape Committee is writing the Caring for Creation article, with an update on our prairie garden. On June 8 the Landscape Committee planted...plastic knives, forks, and spoons? Actually, the bright green cutlery is there to mark where we placed a native prairie plant. We planted a mix of native grasses and flowers, which will bloom from May through October to provide food for pollinators. New plants include Switchgrass, Prairie Dropseed, Pale Coneflower, Purple Coneflower, Whorled Milkweed, Purple Prairie Clover, Prairie Coreopsis, New England Aster, Prairie Smoke, Eastern Bergamot, Goldenrod, Wild Quinine, and Button Blazingstar.

Gardeners have a saying about planting perennial flowers: The first year it sleeps, the second year it creeps, and the third year it leaps; meaning that perennials generally take 3 years to reach full size and flowering. Native plants follow the same principle, because they spend much of the first year developing a strong, deep root system – this is what helps them survive the Midwest’s weather extremes. We may not see a lot of top growth or flowers this year.

We will not add mulch to this garden. Mulch, when applied correctly in a 2 inch layer, has many benefits in ornamental gardens – it preserves moisture in the soil, and prevents weed seeds from germinating. However, it does not belong in a native plant garden, for several reasons:

- Prairie plants did not evolve in a bed of wood chips.
- Mulch will hold moisture close to the surface, so the plants will not grow roots deep into the soil in search of moisture.
- Instead of applying wood-chip mulch, we’ll cut back dried plants in early spring, and leave the cuttings where they fall. This practice is known as “mulch in place” and is used in sustainable landscaping.
- We consulted with local experts on this issue – Pat Armstrong, who helped plant the Morton Arboretum’s prairie, and our own Tom Eisenhart, who is completing a degree in sustainable landscape design at the College of DuPage. The Landscape Committee will water as needed this summer, and remove weeds.

Last year we planted some native plants at the southwest corner, near the chapel. Most of the plants survived the 2019 polar vortex, and we’ll add a few more, to provide more colorful blooms and pollinator food. The soil in that area has been compacted over the years, so we recently added compost from the church compost bin to loosen the soil and add nutrients. Coffee grounds from Sunday morning fellowship have been supplementing our compost pile for years, so all of you who drink coffee on Sunday mornings have helped our new plants!

If you want to learn more about prairie plants, a good local resource is the DuPage chapter of the Wild Ones, and organization that promotes native plants and natural landscapes. You may find information about them at <https://dupage.wildones.org/>

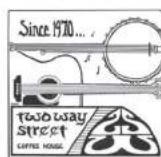
