

Transitions Ahead for our Bridge Family: As we work toward Falisha's annual review in early Spring, there are many things to celebrate. Falisha is receiving positive input from those around her about how settled and happy her three little ones are now. Many of her parenting skills have grown through her time working with Bridge resources, the care and generosity of childcare volunteers from our own church family, her own increasing self-confidence and faith as well as time to work through things with her mentoring team each week. Falisha has also expressed gratitude for recently being able to begin biweekly counseling sessions that were afforded her at a reasonable cost through our church and to finally work to the top of the Bridge waiting list to verify a helpful diagnosis and treatment plan for one of her children. We are also celebrating with Falisha as she anticipates beginning a new full time position in early March. She has struggled through seven months of unemployment or part time employment with the misgivings and anxieties we all know. She has come to trust, in fact, that everything will turn out with the Bridge safety net for housing and job search skills, the encouragement and problem solving of her mentors, support from community resources e.g., Hope's Front Door--all working with her own faithful efforts. We are thankful for your continued prayers and support of this young mother and her family.
