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New Mexico's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 7.5 percent in November 2020, down from 8.1 percent in October and up from 4.8 percent in the previous year. The national unemployment rate in November was 6.7 percent, down from 6.9 percent in October and up from 3.5 percent in November 2019.

Total nonagricultural payroll employment fell by 58,300 jobs, or 6.7 percent, between November 2019 and November 2020. Most losses came from the private sector, which was down 55,700 jobs, or 8.3 percent. The public sector was down 2,600 jobs, or 1.3 percent. Losses were reported in both components of the private sector. The private service-providing industries were down 43,300 jobs, or 7.6 percent, while the goods-producing industries were down 12,400 jobs, representing a decrease of 11.6 percent.

All major industry sectors experienced over-the-year job losses. Leisure and hospitality continued to report the heaviest employment losses, with a drop of 19,400 jobs, or 20.2 percent, compared to the previous year. Employment in mining and construction was down 10,400 jobs, or 13.3 percent. The majority of losses in mining and construction came from mining, which contracted by 6,600 jobs, or 25.6 percent. Construction employment was down 3,800 jobs, or 7.3 percent, over the year. Employment in each of professional and business services (down 5.8 percent) and education and health services (down 4.5 percent) fell by 6,500 jobs. Within the education and health services industry, health care and social assistance was down 3,500 jobs, or 2.9 percent, while educational services was down 3,000 jobs, or 13.4 percent. Trade, transportation, and utilities was down 4,000 jobs, or 2.9 percent. Within the industry, transportation, warehousing, and utilities was down 2,500 jobs, or 9.5 percent; wholesale trade was down 900 jobs, or 4.0 percent; and retail trade was down 600 jobs, or 0.7 percent. Financial activities reported a loss of 2,700 jobs, or 7.5 percent. Miscellaneous *other services* employment decreased by 2,500 jobs, or 8.8 percent. Manufacturing employment decreased by 2,000 jobs, or 6.9 percent. Within this industry, all losses occurred in durable goods manufacturing, which was down 2,200 jobs, or 13.8 percent. Non-durable goods manufacturing employment was up 200 jobs, or 1.6 percent. Information was down 1,700 jobs, or 14.7 percent.

Within the public sector, all losses came in local government, which was down 6,500 jobs, or 6.1 percent. Within local government employment, local government education shed 4,200 jobs, representing a loss of 7.7 percent. Local government excluding education was down 2,300 jobs, or 4.5 percent. Employment in state government was up 3,600 jobs, or 6.2 percent. Within state government, the majority of gains came from state government education which was up 3,200 jobs, or 12.0 percent. Employment in state government excluding education was up 400 jobs, or 1.3 percent. Federal government reported a gain of 300 jobs, or 1.0 percent.
