

The Story of Pentecost Activity Lesson Plan

MATERIALS:

- sheet of construction paper (red if possible) for each child
- tape
- art materials such as crayons, colored pencils, or markers
- copy of ***The Story of Pentecost Activity*** for each child
- pencils

LESSON STEPS:

- Distribute construction paper, art materials, and an activity sheet to each child.
- Help the children arrange the sentences in the correct order and complete the final sentence strip. The correct order of the sentences is:
 1. Early one Sunday morning the disciples were together in one place.
 2. The disciples heard a noise like a strong wind.
 3. They saw what looked like flames of fire over each of them.
 4. The disciples went out into the street.
 5. Answers will vary.
- Invite children to color the tongues of fire beside each sentence.
- Help children affix the sentences in the proper order to the construction paper.
- Gather in the prayer space.
- Pray together, "Holy Spirit, help us to tell others about Jesus Christ."
