Disabled students create mural in Bloomfield

Creation to be unveiled later this month

In mid-June, a large multicolored mural will be hung in a Bloomfield school created by a special group of students.

Detroit artist Hubert Massey and photographer S. Kay Young recently worked with a group of young adults with disabilities as part of a 25-week series created by the Michigan Arts Access Artist-in-Residency program.

The program is run in several of the state's "center-based" special education programs in the Intermediate School District system.

Students from Bloomfield P.R.E.P. went on art-seeking field trips and learned how to take photos with their phones at locations throughout Detroit.

The students painted shapes onto their own 2 foot by 4 foot canvases, cut those shapes out and worked together to create a mural. Massey outlined those shapes and then began on tile work that was glued into the design.

The collaboration on the tile mural that will hang permanently at Bloomfield P.R.E.P. School, a post-secondary education program that serves young adults ages 18 to 26 with developmental and physical disabilities.

Young also worked with the students on photo techniques and how to tell a story using images.

"We visited Hubert Massey's studio and many of his murals in the city, as well as my large-scale photograph 'Fish' at Huntington Place. Along with documenting the creation of the mural, our talented students have taken some amazing self-portraits," said S. Kay Young

Artists, students, teachers, and parents will review the mural and photographs in a special celebration on Wednesday, May 18 at 10:30 a.m. at The Hawk Community Center located at 29995 W. Twelve Mile Road in Farmington Hills.
