L: A READING FROM HEBREWS

¹⁰It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many children to glory, should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings.

¹¹For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified all have one Father.

For this reason Jesus is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters,

¹²saying,

“I will proclaim your name to my brothers and sisters,
in the midst of the congregation I will praise you.”

¹³And again, “I will put my trust in him.”

And again, “Here am I and the children whom God has given me.”

¹⁴Since, therefore, the children share flesh and blood, he himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil,

²⁰"Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead."


²¹Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel.
