## Invitation to the Way of the Cross

P: Let us now walk the way of the cross. Let us now listen well and pray the stories of life and death, of love's victory over hate and violence, of the everlasting destiny of peace. For there is no other boast than in the cross of Jesus, through whom the world has been crucified for the glory of God. For when we are weak, we are strong. Let us now make our journey with Christ.



### **THE FIRST STATION: Jesus Prays in the Garden of Olives**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Luke 22:39-46

39He came out and went, as was his custom, to the Mount of Olives; and the disciples followed him. 40When he reached the place, he said to them, "Pray that you may not come into the time of trial." 41Then he withdrew from them about a stone's throw, knelt down, and prayed, 42Father, if you are willing, remove this cup from me; yet, not my will but yours be done. 43Then an angel from heaven appeared to him and gave him strength. 44In his anguish he prayed more earnestly, and his sweat became like great drops of blood falling down on the ground. 45When he got up from prayer, he came to the disciples and found them sleeping because of grief, 46and he said to them, "Why are you sleeping? Get up and pray that you may not come into the time of trial."

### THE SECOND STATION: Jesus is Betrayed by Judas

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

C: **Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Matthew 26:45-49

45Then he came to the disciples and said to them, "Are you still sleeping and taking your rest? See, the hour is at hand, and the Son of Man is betrayed into the hands of sinners. 46Get up, let us be going. See, my betrayer is at hand." 47While he was still speaking, Judas, one of the twelve, arrived; with him was a large crowd with swords and clubs, from the chief priests and the elders of the people. 48Now the betrayer had given them a sign, saying, "The one I will kiss is the man; arrest him." 49At once he came up to Jesus and said, "Greetings, Rabbi!" and kissed him.

*Jesus, Remember Me (see First Station)*

P: Christ Jesus, it is painful and difficult for us to imagine the pain of your betrayal, especially by a friend. Yet, as always, you responded in love, even in the midst of humiliation and abandonment. Help us to remember that when we betray you, we betray ourselves. Lord in your mercy,

**C: hear our prayer.**



### **THE THIRD STATION: Jesus is Condemned to Death by the Sanhedrin**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Mark 14:56, 61-64

<sup>56</sup>For many gave false testimony against him, and their testimony did not agree. <sup>61</sup>But he was silent and did not answer. Again the high priest asked him, “Are you the Messiah, the Son of the Blessed One?” <sup>62</sup>Jesus said, “I am; and ‘you will see the Son of Man seated at the right hand of the Power,’ and ‘coming with the clouds of heaven.’” <sup>63</sup>Then the high priest tore his clothes and said, “Why do we still need witnesses? <sup>64</sup>You have heard his blasphemy! What is your decision?” All of them condemned him as deserving death.

P: Christ Jesus, you faced the leaders of your time, and felt their hateful judgment. They did not believe in you, Christ our healer. They did not believe in you Christ our teacher. When they say you, they did not see God. Lord in your mercy,

### **THE FOURTH STATION: Jesus is Denied by Peter**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Luke 22:54-62

<sup>54</sup>Then they seized him and led him away, bringing him into the high priest's house. But Peter was following at a distance. <sup>55</sup>When they had kindled a fire in the middle of the courtyard and sat down together, Peter sat among them. <sup>56</sup>Then a servant-

girl, seeing him in the firelight, stared at him and said, "This man also was with him."  
57But he denied it, saying, "Woman, I do not know him." 58A little later someone else, on seeing him, said, "You also are one of them." But Peter said, "Man, I am not!" 59Then about an hour later still another kept insisting, "Surely this man also was with him; for he is a Galilean." 60But Peter said, "Man, I do not know what you are talking about!" At that moment, while he was still speaking, the cock crowed.  
61The Lord turned and looked at Peter. Then Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said to him, "Before the cock crows today, you will deny me three times." 62And he went out and wept bitterly.

P: Christ Jesus, we know the horror of the rejection you experienced, and the hatred you received for being true to yourself. We feel deep sorrow as you must have, for we too have denied you, and our truest selves. Lord in your mercy,

### **THE FIFTH STATION: Jesus is Judged by Pilate**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Luke 23:20-25

20Pilate, wanting to release Jesus, addressed them again; 21but they kept shouting, "Crucify, crucify him!" 22A third time he said to them, "Why, what evil has he done? I have found in him no ground for the sentence of death; I will therefore have him flogged and then release him." 23But they kept urgently demanding with loud shouts that he should be crucified; and their voices prevailed. 24So Pilate gave his verdict that their demand should be granted. 25He released the man they asked for, the one who had been put in prison for insurrection and murder, and he handed Jesus over as they wished.

### **THE SIXTH STATION: Jesus is Scourged and Crowned with Thorns**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: John 19:1-3

Then Pilate took Jesus and had him flogged. <sup>2</sup>And the soldiers wove a crown of thorns and put it on his head, and they dressed him in a purple robe. <sup>3</sup>They kept coming up to him, saying, "Hail, King of the Jews!" and striking him on the face.

P: Christ Jesus, we walk with you in the midst of judgment. We are with you now, and we stand with you in the midst of the horror, the beatings, the mocking, and the shallowness and dishonesty behind it all. Lord in your mercy,

### **THE SEVENTH STATION: Jesus Carries His Cross**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: John 19:17

<sup>17</sup>and carrying the cross by himself, he went out to what is called The Place of the Skull, which in Hebrew is called Golgotha.

Jesus, Remember Me

P: Christ Jesus, the path of the cross is a painful one, a journey of grief, a road of darkness. Yet, during this time, you show us the way of courage, you show us the way of tremendous strength. In the midst of the horror, God did not abandon you, and we believe that you will never abandon us. Lord in your mercy,

### **THE EIGHTH STATION: Jesus is Helped by Simon of Cyrene**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Mark 15:20-21

<sup>20</sup>After mocking him, they stripped him of the purple cloak and put his own clothes on him. Then they led him out to crucify him.<sup>21</sup>They compelled a passer-by, who was coming in from the country, to carry his cross; it was Simon of Cyrene, the father of Alexander and Rufus.

Jesus, Remember Me

P: Christ Jesus, yours is the way of generosity, yours is the way of love and healing. Yours is the way of attentiveness. You call us to inconvenience ourselves for the sake of another, to be present to all of those who cry out for help. We remember the power and wonder of your teaching. Lord in your mercy,

### **THE NINTH STATION: Jesus Encounters the Women of Jerusalem**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Luke 23:27-31

<sup>27</sup>A great number of the people followed him, and among them were women who were beating their breasts and wailing for him. <sup>28</sup>But Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me, but weep for yourselves and for your children. <sup>29</sup>For the days are surely coming when they will say, 'Blessed are the barren, and the wombs that never bore, and the breasts that never nursed.' <sup>30</sup>Then they will begin to say to the mountains, 'Fall on us'; and to the hills,

'Cover us.' <sup>31</sup>For if they do this when the wood is green, what will happen when it is dry?"

P: Christ Jesus, we know that you called women in a special way to help proclaim and give witness to your message, your glory, your salvation, and your plan for our lives. These women help us to confront our grief; the loss of the possibilities of new life and birth, and our ache to lament and cry out in our pain. Lord in your mercy,

### **THE TENTH STATION: Jesus is Crucified**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Mark 15:22-26

<sup>22</sup>Then they brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means the place of a skull). <sup>23</sup>And they offered him wine mixed with myrrh; but he did not take it. <sup>24</sup>And they crucified him, and divided his clothes among them, casting lots to decide what each should take. It was nine o'clock in the morning when they crucified him. <sup>26</sup>The inscription of the charge against him read, "The King of the Jews."

P: Christ Jesus, your response to God's call was one of total surrender, total understanding, clear and resolute, knowing well what the cost would be. Your response led you to choose against the values and will of your times, and this cause is still at odds with the forces that surround us now. Lord in your mercy,

### **THE ELEVENTH STATION: Jesus Promises to Share His Reign with the Good Thief**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Luke 23:39-43

<sup>39</sup>One of the criminals who were hanged there kept deriding him and saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us!" <sup>40</sup>But the other rebuked him, saying, "Do you not fear God, since you are under the same sentence of condemnation? <sup>41</sup>And we indeed have been condemned justly, for we are getting what we deserve for our deeds, but this man has done nothing wrong." <sup>42</sup>Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." <sup>43</sup>He replied, "Truly I tell you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

P: Christ Jesus, your openness to God helps all of us to see goodness in the midst of evil. Your story is the story of love showered upon us all, even in the midst of hate and violence. Lord in your mercy,

**THE TWELFTH STATION: Jesus Speaks to Mary and the Beloved Disciple at the Foot of the Cross**

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: John 19:25-27

<sup>25</sup>And that is what the soldiers did. Meanwhile, standing near the cross of Jesus were his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. <sup>26</sup>When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing beside her, he said to his mother, "Woman, here is your son." <sup>27</sup>Then he said to the disciple, "Here is your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his own home.



## THE THIRTEENTH STATION: Jesus Dies on the Cross

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Matthew 27:45-50

<sup>45</sup>From noon on, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon. <sup>46</sup>And about three o'clock Jesus cried with a loud voice, "Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?" that is, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" <sup>47</sup>When some of the bystanders heard it, they said, "This man is calling for Elijah." <sup>48</sup>At once one of them ran and got a sponge, filled it with sour wine, put it on a stick, and gave it to him to drink. <sup>49</sup>But the others said, "Wait, let us see whether Elijah will come to save him." <sup>50</sup>Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last.

## THE FOURTEENTH STATION: Jesus Is Placed in the Tomb

P: We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you.

**C: Because by your holy Cross you have redeemed the whole world.**

Reading: Matthew 27:57-61

<sup>57</sup>When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea, named Joseph, who was also a disciple of Jesus. <sup>58</sup>He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus; then Pilate ordered it to be given to him. <sup>59</sup>So Joseph took the body and wrapped it in a clean linen cloth <sup>60</sup>and laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn in the rock. He then rolled a great stone to the door of the tomb and went away. <sup>61</sup>Mary Magdalene and the other Mary were there, sitting opposite the tomb.

P: Christ Jesus, we now take a moment to remember the final days and nights of your most precious life on this earth. As we remember your being placed in the tomb by those who followed and loved you, we call to mind the many trials, betrayals, denials, and times of horror that we experience in our own lives. Lord in your mercy,

### **Final Prayer and Blessing**

P: Let us pray...Christ Jesus, you call us all to look beyond sadness; not to look for the living among the dead, but to recognize all that is vibrant and alive in us, your Body of Christ. You call us to rejoice in the presence of your Spirit as it moves around and within us. You call us to always move forward, not to look back. Be with us now, and help us as we strive daily to take up our cross, to become your resurrection, and proclaim your new life to the world. For we believe that by your cross and resurrection you have set us free. You are the Savior of the world, and let the Church say:


**C: Amen!**
