From the Pastor . . .

As we approach Thanksgiving Day, we should slow down to consider all of the things for which we are thankful. A standard hymn sung at many Thanksgiving celebrations comes from the late 18th century, but its roots might surprise you. The following piece comes from "The One Year Book of Hymns." (November 22; Tyndale House Publishers, Wheaton, IL)

Matthias Claudius had no intention of writing a hymn. A German journalist, he was merely writing a poem about a group of peasants gathering for a banquet. The poem, originally enti-



tioned "Paul Erdmann's Fest," in seventeen stanzas depicts friends coming over to Paul Erdmann's house and enjoying themselves. It praises both Paul Erdmann for his hospitality and God as the ultimate source of the feast.

It was Jane Campbell, a British music teacher, who made the free translation of this poem into its present English form. She contributed it to a new hymnal in 1861, along with some other translations from German. It has become a favorite harvest hymn in modern churches. The hymn

gained new popularity when John Michael Tebelak and Steven Schwartz included it in their 1960s musical *Godspell*.

In any era the sentiments are valid. God has given us all the good things we have, and He deserves our thanks.

In this season, I am thankful for you and this church, and I pray God's richest harvest in your life. May our Father continue to lead us and provide His Holy Spirit, that we may be a blessing to Him, and continue to give reason for God to be thankful for us as well!

Health Ministry Corner

This is National Home Care and Hospice Month.

Sometimes it seems as if compassion is in short supply. National Home Care and Hospice Month reminds us to thank those angels of mercy who tirelessly help sick people cope, help the elderly to age in



place, and provide loving spaces for people at life's end. Here's some important facts about Hospice care:

- Hospice manages multiple disease states.** It's for people with advanced illnesses. Whatever the age or diagnosis of loved ones, it can help if they have a serious progressive illness.
- Hospice can happen anywhere.** It's a service that comes to the patient, wherever the patient calls home. That can be a private residence, a nursing home, etc.
- Hospice is an option.** Patients can leave or "revoke" their hospice status at any time for any reason.

- Patients can continue with medications and treatments while on hospice.** Patients can continue with treatments that relieve symptoms and improve quality of life.
- Hospice provides medications related to the patient's diagnosis to control symptoms.**
- Hospice care is usually provided by family caregivers, with support from the Hospice team.** Licensed clinicians come to the home rather than have the patient go to a physician's office. Family or friends take on the role of primary caregivers, supported by a team that includes a nurse, hospice aide, social worker, physician, chaplain, etc. The team makes regularly scheduled visits and trains family caregivers.
- There's no limit to the time a patient can be on hospice.** It's for patients who are expected to live 6 months or less, but it can be extended if needed. In many cases, patients who receive hospice services live longer than those who do not receive it.
- Hospice provides home medical equipment and supplies.** They provide supplies such as shower chairs, hospital

beds, incontinence supplies and more. Having free equipment readily available is



convenient and can improve quality of life for the patient and caregivers.

- Hospice cares for the family.** The team addresses emotional and spiritual pain suffered by loved ones. In fact, bereavement support for the family continues for more than a year after the death.
- 99% of hospice patients don't have any out-of-pocket expenses.** Medicare and most private insurance plans cover hospice 100%, including home visits, medications, supplies & equipment.

The Recipe Box Hearty Soup

Hearty Soup

- 1 lb ground sirloin
- 8 oz pkg green beans
- 9 oz pkg cheese tortellini
- 28 oz can Progresso tomatoes with puree
- 3 to 3 1/2 cups water
- 1 Tblsp basil
- 1 can French onion soup
- 1 zucchini, sliced
- (I added about 1/2 tsp sugar)

In soup pot, sauté meat. Drain grease. Add all ingredients but zucchini to browned meat. Cook 10 minutes over medium heat.

Add zucchini to pot. Continue cooking till zucchini is tender, about 20 minutes. (you can also add other vegetables (canned corn, spinach, etc)
