## From the Pastor . . .

From Sundays and Seasons, 2019, Augsburg Fortress:

*When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. <sup>2</sup> And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. <sup>3</sup> Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. <sup>4</sup> All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. (Acts 2:1-4)*

In the story of Pentecost, the author of Luke/Acts gives focus and frame to the lives of Jesus' disciples. While there's no telling to whom the disciples will be sent, the ways in which the disciples will bear witness to the good news of Jesus, or how the disciples will be empowered, equipped, and surprised as they follow where Jesus leads, the Spirit's presence and power will be with them. When the Spirit "calls, gathers, enlightens, and makes holy," as Martin Luther says, Jesus' disciples are crucified and raised, shaped and shaken for relationship with the wider world in ways that are authentic and vulnerable. Jesus' disciples embody what Pope Francis describes as a community that is "bruised, hurting, and dirty because it has been out on the streets, rather than a church which is unhealthy

from being confined, and clinging to its own security." (Evangelii Gaudium, 49)

Luke's story of Jesus brings the disciples face-to-face with brokenness, hurt, and economic disparity. Luke's narrative (as we will make our way through it this summer) reveals Jesus at the margins of society so that people hidden are seen and people silenced are heard. They witness Jesus healing a man plagued by de-



mons (Luke 8:26-39), hear the story of the Samaritan, the outsider who shows mercy (10:25-37), and the women Mary and Martha, also outsiders to whom Jesus draws near (10:38-42). Disciples are sent by the Spirit into the margins with Jesus, to see and listen, to encounter and understand, to pay attention to the stories of others. In these encounters, their own understanding of God's love, healing, and mercy are broadened and challenged.

I invite you to **read the Book of Acts** over the next couple of weeks, a chapter at a time, and watch the Holy Spirit at work through the disciples as they take the message of the Gospel and share with an ever

-widening population, so many of whom join in communion with them through the work and power of the Holy Spirit. And as you do, please reflect on just how the Spirit works in the disciples, and so in us, to bring about Kingdom Culture wherever they go and wherever they are. Note how the Spirit empowers them, and consider just how the Spirit might desire to empower us as well for sharing the message so that others might commune also with God the Father through His Son Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit.

I keep coming back to that word – power – *dunamis* in the Greek (from which we get the word "dynamite") – "You will receive power" Jesus has said to his church, "when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses..." I want to know, and I want you to know, and I want those around us to know the power of which Jesus speaks, that he might be glorified in all things and draw people to himself through us. Let's continue to pray, **"Come, Holy Spirit!"**

## Health Ministry Corner

**Psalm 139:15** My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place.

We wonder why God would make a child with birth defects. I've heard people say God doesn't make mistakes. He knows all but He has his reasons. We can't be privy to all His ways. Fortunately, He has given doctors the ability to fix some of them. The following is from the website:

July is **National Cleft and Craniofacial Awareness Month**, an effort to improve understanding of birth defects of the head and face. Each year in the U.S. thousands of babies are born with a cleft, occurring when tissue in the baby's upper lip or roof of the mouth does not join together completely during pregnancy.

The defect may be genetic or the result of maternal environmental exposures during pregnancy. This year, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) is highlighting research on the association between smoking during early pregnancy and orofacial clefts. In the U.S., about 7,000 babies are born with orofacial clefts each year. Women are encouraged who are thinking about becoming pregnant

to quit smoking before pregnancy or as soon as they find out that they are pregnant.



Cleft and craniofacial conditions are commonly associated with other countries, though they also occur frequently in the U.S. Cleft lip is one of the most common birth defects in the U.S., according to the CDC. There is no single factor related to the cause of cleft.

Clefts are usually repaired surgically in the first year of life, though many children require additional surgeries and treatments through adolescence to correct challenges to breathing,

eating or speech development. Individuals born with cleft lip or palate often need specialized dental or orthodontic care throughout their lives as well. Despite unique health challenges, those born with cleft and craniofacial conditions lead fulfilling, successful, and accomplished lives.

Some children with clefts may have issues with self-esteem if they are concerned with visible differences between themselves and other children. Parent-to-parent support groups can prove to be useful for families of babies with birth defects.

# The Recipe Box Scones



Scones

SHARED BY . . . Libby Nelson! These are wonderful and easy!

- 2 cups flour
- 2/3 cup sugar
- 1 Tbsp baking powder
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 cup butter, cubed, cold
- 1/2 cup currants or mini chocolate chips or other fruits or nuts
- 1 cup heavy cream

Sift flour, sugar, baking powder & salt together in large bowl. Rub butter into dry ingredients using fingertips, taking care not to melt butter.

Let currants soak in hot water for 15 mins to allow them to puff up & then drain well (do the same if using other fruit). Stir in currants (or fruit or nuts). Stir in cream, mixing just enough to form dough into a disc, 9 inch in diameter.

Transfer to parchment & cut into 8 wedges. If using biscuit cutter, roll out 2/3 inch deep.

Bake in hot °450 oven, 17 - 20 mins, till tops are golden.

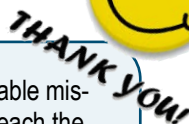

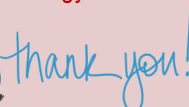
