Important Notes

The End of Year surveys may use terms that are not commonly used by DME, but have similar meanings. Below is a guide to help you:

1. **Basic Science Courses** – Basic science disciplines that are integrated throughout the pre-clerkship courses
2. **Biostatistics/Epidemiology** – EBCR 1 and 2
3. **Introduction to Clinical Medicine/Introduction to the Patient** – Doctoring 1 and 2
4. **Emergency Medicine Clerkship** – MCOM does not have an Emergency Medicine clerkship
5. **Internal Medicine Clerkship** – Adult Medicine Clerkship
6. **Family Medicine Clerkship** – Primary Care Clerkship
7. **Office of the Dean of Students/Associate Dean for Students** – Drs. Kira Zwygart and Melissa Brannen
8. **Office of the Dean of Educational Programs/Curricular Affairs** – Drs. Deborah DeWaay, Craig Doupnik, and Bri Anne McKeon
9. **Career Planning Services** – MD Career Advising – Drs. Milind Kothari and Antoinette Spoto-Cannons
10. **Academic Counseling/Tutoring** – Dr. Pamela O'Callaghan
11. **Library** – Shimberg, Florida Blue Health Knowledge Exchange, Lehigh Valley Health Network
12. **Self-Directed Learning** – is learner-directed, meaning learners are responsible for their own learning and take initiative to (a) self-assess learning needs, (b) independently identify, analyze, synthesize, and apply relevant information, (c) appraise the credibility of information sources, (d) seek, receive, and incorporate feedback on these skills, (e) evaluate the efficacy of their learning outcomes, and (f) not the amount of time necessary to study for exams
