

AMA FOUNDATION PHYSICIANS OF TOMORROW SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The AMAF offers \$10,000 tuition-based scholarships to rising final-year medical students. Students can only apply in one category.

ELIGIBILITY

- Must be a rising final-year student (third-year students who are approaching their final year of medical school, set to graduate in May/June 2025). If a student is in a five-year program, they can be nominated either at the end of their third year or prior to their final year in medical school.
- Must be currently enrolled in an accredited United States allopathic or osteopathic medical school.
- Must be permanent residents or citizens of the United States or have DACA status.
- *Note: AMA membership or non-membership is not taken into consideration when determining the recipients.*

CATEGORIES

AMA Foundation Physicians of Tomorrow (General)

- Subcategory: Sleep Medicine
 - **Sleep medicine (made possible by the American Academy of Sleep Medicine):** applicants must demonstrate an interest in pursuing sleep medicine as a sub-specialty in internal medicine, psychiatry, pediatrics, neurology, etc. as part of their application process/personal statement.

Underrepresented in Medicine: For African American/Black, Latine/Hispanic or American Indian/Native Hawaiian/Alaska Native scholars who demonstrate a dedication to serving vulnerable or underserved populations.

AMA Alliance Grassroots: Students must have an interest in women's and/or children's health.

David Jones Peck, MD Scholarship for Health Equity: Applicants must show a commitment to addressing health disparities and promoting health equity in diverse, economically disadvantaged urban environments

Dr. Richard Allen Williams & Genita Evangelista Johnson/Association of Black Cardiologists (\$5,000 scholarship): Students must be African American/Black with an interest in cardiology.

DREAM MD Equity Scholarship: Awarded to a medical student beneficiary of the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program and/or first-generation immigrant to the United States who has a demonstrated history of public advocacy for the equitable treatment of immigrants.

H. Hugh Vincent, MD Family Scholarship for Physicians of the Future: Students must be enrolled in an accredited California-based medical school, with a preference for those with interest in medical advocacy, anesthesiology, critical care, surgery and/or rural practice.

The Herman E. Diskin, MD Memorial Scholarship: Students must demonstrate a strong commitment to humanitarian public service and compassionate patient care.

Illinois Physicians of Tomorrow Scholarship: Students must be permanent residents of Illinois who are involved in organized medicine and have expressed plans of practicing in Illinois after completing residency.

Dr. Lin and Minta Hill Alexander Physicians of Tomorrow Scholarship: Students must be attending medical school in Oklahoma.

MSSNY/Dr. Duane and Joyce Cady Physicians of Tomorrow Scholarship: Students must attend school in the State of New York, be actively involved in organized medicine and have expressed plans to practice in New York.

Ohio Physicians of Tomorrow Scholarship: Students must attend school in the State of Ohio and be actively involved in, or willing to become involved in, organized medicine.
