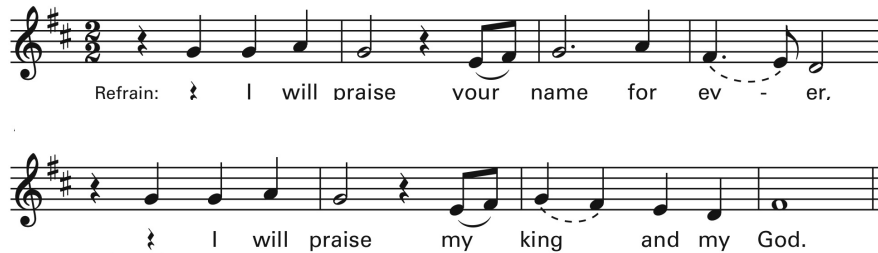

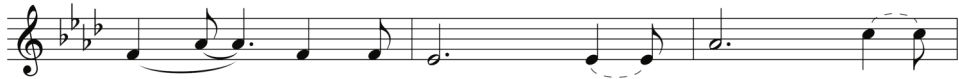

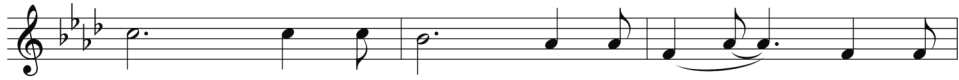

An Act of Spiritual Communion


