Sarah Morice Brubaker is Associate Professor of Christian Systematic Theology at Phillips Theological Seminary, and currently serves as the board chair for the Westar Institute, with whom she has also served as a scholar since 2015. She has co-chaired the Liberal Theologies Program Unit of the American Academy of Religion, published numerous articles and essays, and presented papers and keynote addresses at academic and church conferences.

She currently attends Pilgrimage Mennonite Fellowship in Tulsa which she helped to co-found, although her roots are in the United Church of Christ. A former theatre kid, she has recently returned to the stage and has performed locally with Theatre Tulsa and Blackjack Rewrite Company, and will be performing with the Pembroke Players in an experimental production of Hamlet at the end of June. She is married to Phil and is mom to Nathan, a student at Saint Louis University, and Micah, a student at Riverfield Country Day School.
