The VA has an ongoing agreement with Walgreen Drug Stores (over 8,000 nationwide) for Vets to get free flu shots at Walgreens. A VA picture ID is supposedly needed. Use Group ID "VAFLU." Be aware, there are two strength doses of flu vaccine, the regular dose and a stronger dose for those over 65 and/or with medical issues. Ask the resident pharmacy folks which one is appropriate in your case.

The Veteran's Day Parade will be in Friday, November 10<sup>th</sup> so school kids can attend. American Legion Post 308 will have a veterans food event after the parade at their Garnett and East Admiral Place facility. The last Parade meeting will be November 8<sup>th</sup> at 11 AM at VFW Post 577.

The Center for Individuals with Physical Challenges, at 11<sup>th</sup> and Utica, (815 S. Utica, 918-584-8607) has started to help with vets physical fitness and rehabilitee. Vickie Holler, noted that and work before Veteran's Day can be free for all activities and sports. After this date, a \$20 per month fee will be charged for facility use. However, this fee can be dropped to \$10 depending on need.

-A complementary week for vets will be November 6-10. .

-If unsure of your disability, they serve diabetes, strokes, chronic pain, MS, amputees, spinal cord and back injuries and more.

-Vets must show a valid VA ID or DD214.

The VA Regional Office in Muskogee noted many activities and open house events will be held during Veteran's Month in November. On November 8<sup>th</sup> there will be a webcast, on November 11<sup>th</sup>, ceremonies will be held at Ft. Gibson.

-It was noted over 47,000 disability claims had been processed YTD: a record! However, about 2,400 applications are pending. The phone center has processed over 3 million calls YTD.

Also noted was that USA JOBS had many job openings, including call center operators in Muskogee.

The new Bartlesville VA Center will open later this year.

The Oklahoma Employment Security Group noted another job fair On Thursday, October 26<sup>th</sup> at the Eastgate Metroplex, 14002 E. 21<sup>st</sup> Street. Bring your resume! It opens at 9 AM for Vets and will be open from 10 AM to 2 PM for the general public.

-Over 88 employers will be there looking to hire vets before the 2<sup>nd</sup> week of November, if possible.

The American Veteran's Motorcycle Club will have a 2018 billiards tourney, and their Riverwalk Rally will be June 16<sup>th</sup> next year.

The Community Food Banks of Eastern Oklahoma noted about 24% of their vets need some sort of help or support, especially with food.

PAM Rehabilitation Hospital of Tulsa is celebrating its grand opening on Tuesday, November 7<sup>th</sup> from 4-7 PM. This is located at 10020 East 91<sup>st</sup> Street. Events include cocktails, hors d'oeuvres, music and more. RSVP to Jamie McKee Evans at 918-940-8803.

Goodwill was again in attendance. They noted they have many classes and resources to help vets. They are on Southwest Boulevard in their large building at about 2800 SW Blvd.

Tulsa Tech again noted they are available with many free courses for vets that are not counted as use of GI Bill benefits. These classes are available to vets within 15 years of their separation from service.

The Andy Coleman for Congress group had a speaker noting Andy's campaign for US Congress, Oklahoma 1. He is a Republican candidate.

The Veteran's Day Parade will have many gather at the VFW for a breakfast starting at 7 AM. American Legion Post 1 will have a BBQ after the parade.

TU had a first time representative at the meeting. He noted that there was tuition assistance available for vets as well as job placement assistance upon graduation.

A group helps lady vets with a college recruiter representing three local colleges. This group is combined with TU. They also take part in food drives with the Coffee Bunker. Their group also sends care packages to overseas vets.

-An ongoing need for money donations was noted as it costs over \$15 to send each vet's package overseas and between 100-300 are sent every month.

The Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs recognized Ashley Wells, Constituent Services Caseworker for Congressman Bridenstine, for her most excellent support of our veterans. Volunteers of America noted their availability to help vets find employment, do resumes and other job related activities. In some cases, financial help may be available.

Legal Services of Oklahoma noted they still provide civil help to vets.

Jim Inhoff's representative gave a report on his activites.

Senator Lankford's representative noted he was very busy in Washington, but to any vets needing help, to please contact his office for assistance.

Mitch Reed, OK Commander, Military Order of the Purple Heart, noted Bixby will become a Purple Heart City on Saturday, with Collinsville and Barnstall to come.

Amy Brown of the Mayor's office was present and noted if you don't call, they can't help you!

DAV noted they needed volunteers for the upcoming 5 K Run. They noted Tulsa is the 5K national home city for this event. Multiple teams were noted as trying to out fund the others! Eagle Ops is still trying to be the largest team in the nation. -The ROTC group of young adults Dan Snow works with was challenged to raise about \$850 to cover group expenses. They blew this goal away with \$2,200 in raised funds. This group will have 22 rucks in the 5 K race.
