Tom is a decorated, disabled, ex-combat veteran of the Vietnam War. He was wounded in action and lost use of both hands but through a few years of therapy he regained their use. He was then asked by the head of therapy at the military hospital he was in to illustrate the most comprehensive book on Occupational Therapy at that time which he did.

Beatriz Marquez , a Cuban American, immigrated to the United States at the age of six. Being bilingual and having family in Cuba, she maintains a strong connection to her cultural roots.

Bea thought she would pursue a career in fiber arts after high school, but financial constraints pushed her into the emerging world of Information Technology in 1978. During her 30+ year career in technology she worked in many capacities, her favorite time being the 15 years she spent in translation management. This passion led her to leave corporate America in 2015 in pursuit of studying machine translation, a part of another emerging world, Artificial Intelligence. At Montclair State University she studied Computational Linguistics, attaining a graduate certificate. Her mother's failing health and COVID short-circuited her work in the Masters program.

Bea has not lost her love of fiber or art though. She finds joy in writing, photography and just plain living, considering herself a "creative". She likes Flemish art, the works of Albrecht Duhrer, and Wassily Kandinsky. Her favorite painting, the "The Horse Fair" by Rosa Bonheur, exemplifies everything she thinks art can be. She says when she is near it, she can feel the thundering of the hooves and the dust kicked up by their movement- a little paint creating transcendence.

Bea discovered the Ocean County Artists Guild shortly after she came to Ocean County to care for her mother. Judy LePore encouraged her to volunteer as a receptionist which eventually led to her taking the job as our office administrator

What Bea appreciates most about being a part of the Guild is the vibrant energy that permeates the environment. She is particularly impressed with the diverse range of classes, concerts, exhibits, and the active community participation. While Bea hasn't had the opportunity to showcase her artwork at the gallery, she says her solo show is being at the guild Monday to Friday from 9-3!
