Provides a **safe** environment for children to learn, grow and play. Teaches children about good nutrition and how to stay healthy.



CHILD DEVELOPMENT ARCHITECT

Helps children learn by exploring in a constructive, interesting, and enjoyable **learning environment**. Develops children's motor skills and **physical** capabilities with age-appropriate equipment and experiences.

BRAIN DEVELOPMENT WIZ

Promotes curiosity, **cognitive** reasoning, learning through play and problem solving to lay the foundation for future learning.

Builds up a child's **communication** skills through verbal and non-verbal methods.

Expands a child's **creative** capabilities through music, movement, and visual arts.

Provides each child with **guidance** on how to behave acceptably in society.

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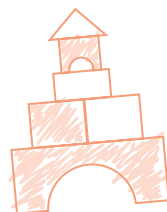
FAMILY ADVOCATE
