# CHILD DEVELOPMENT ARCHITECT

Helps children learn by exploring in a constructive, interesting, and enjoyable learning environment. Develops children's motor skills and **physical** capabilities with age-appropriate equipment and experiences.



#### KINDNESS INFLUENCER

Supports children in developing social skills and respecting others.
