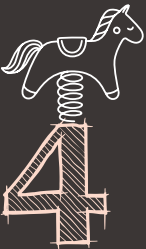
CHILD DEVELOPMENT ARCHITECT

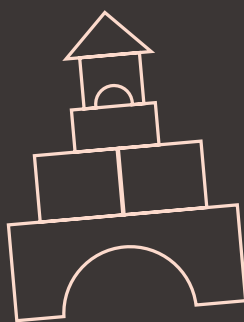
COMMUNICATON GURU

Builds up a child's **communication** skills through verbal and non-verbal methods.

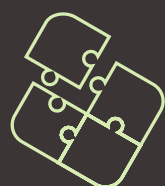

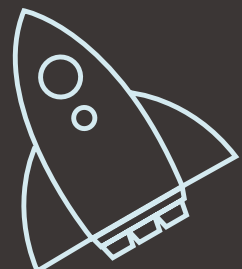
Expands a child's **creative** capabilities through music, movement, and visual arts.
