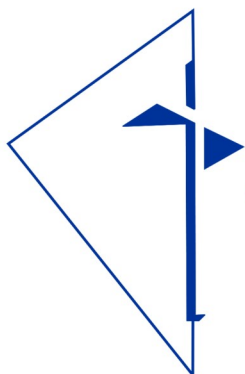

Hymn Note for “Here in North Carolina’s Mountains”: Thank you to the Rev. Lesley Bush, Minister of Music and Organist, for sharing information about Tryon Presbyterian Church’s history, mission and ministry.

Verses 1 and 2: A 100th anniversary celebration is a good time to look back at the seeds of faith that were planted by past generations. For information about the church’s history, see: *Tryon Presbyterian Church: A Centennial Celebration*, by Robin Spencer Lattimore, from the church’s 100th anniversary celebration. Dr. Dent Davis, minister of the church, is quoted in the history, reflecting on the witness of generations of faithful church members.

Verse 3: The church history talks about how the town has a “reputation as a gathering place for artists, intellectuals, scholars, and writers.” These people have joined with the long-time families who have a deep tradition and skills and talents of their own. Also in verse 3: The church history includes this reflection: “The important question for us today as we celebrate 90 years of history for Tryon Presbyterian Church is what kind of legacy will we leave for those who follow us?” The same question can be asked as the church celebrates 100 years. “Justice” has been defined as “bringing wholeness, making things right” in this hurting world. “Service” is following in the way of Jesus who came not to be served, but to serve others.

Verse 4: The first two lines of this verse are basically the church’s mission statement: “To be and make disciples of Jesus Christ, who love God and their neighbor.” Verse 4 also celebrates the strong music ministry of the church, and the church’s worship as a central part of its work and service.

Verse 5: An anniversary celebration is not just about remembering the past. How is God calling the church to move into the future? The church’s history contains this statement: “It is the fervent prayer of the session and the members of this church that the vision and faith exhibited by the founders of this congregation will live on in love and service throughout the community and our world, to the Glory of God and His Son, Jesus Christ.”

“ODE TO JOY or HYMN TO JOY is the adaptation of Beethoven’s famous final movement in his Ninth Symphony into a melody fit for congregational singing. Around 1908, Henry Jackson Van Dyke wrote his text [“Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee] to be “sung to the music of Beethoven’s ‘Hymn to Joy’” (*Hymnstudies*, homeschoolblogger.com). The tune has an 87.87.D meter, which Austin Lovelace describes as having the “ability to carry massive ideas in its fifteen syllables per double line” (*Anatomy of Hymnody*, 74). It is a tune of grandeur and, fittingly, joy. It almost begs to be sung in a fast, upbeat manner; Jerry Jenkins writes, “the tune is so reminiscent of sprightly harpsichords that the words begin to bounce, and suddenly I’m singing it the way it was meant to be sung – at least in style” (*Hymns for Personal Devotions*, 132). (Hymnary)

Carolyn Winfrey Gillette is a writer of over 400 hymns that are published in over 20 books (including her most recent one (August 2022), *I Sing to My Savior: New Hymns from the Stories in the Gospel of Luke*). *The Christian Century*, *The New Yorker*, *Sojourners*, *Washington Post*, *Philadelphia Inquirer*, *NPR* and *PBS-TV* have done feature stories on how her hymns relate faith to concerns in the church and world. She has been a Presbyterian pastor in rural, small town, suburban city churches; she has also served as a hospice chaplain, a hospital chaplain and a school bus aide helping children with special needs.
