

Beware of Fraudulent Emails

Our ministers and staff will never email you asking for any money besides your pledge payment!

Before responding to strange sounding emails that seem like they are from one of our ministers, always look at the email address it came from carefully, to be sure it is legitimate. Many times these are [.gmail.com](#) or [hughesnet.com](#) addresses being used by the thieves.

If you would like to report the fraudulent phishing scam, here's how to do it:

Step 1. If you received a phishing email, forward it to the FTC at spam@uce.gov and to the Anti-Phishing Working Group at reportphishing@apwg.org. If you got a phishing text message, forward it to SPAM (7726).

Step 2. Report the phishing attack to the FTC at ftc.gov/complaint.
