

## Green Camino Composting Update for September

You should have received a new lock code for the drop-off cabinets via email. If you did not, please call 812-269-2280 to register or get a re-send.

We also have a few tips/reminders for you to help us improve everyone's drop-off experience:

**First and foremost**, if you experience any issues with the drop-off cabinets, please contact us **immediately at (812) 269 2280**; you can leave a voicemail or you can send us a text. You can also contact us by email at [info@greencaminocompost.com](mailto:info@greencaminocompost.com).

We've had some issues with subscribers accidentally resetting the lock combination while using the drop-off. We've placed new signs at all our drop-off cabinets and we ask that you please take the time to review the sign and follow the instructions to avoid resetting the combination and locking us all out of the cabinet (we've attached a copy of the sign at the end of this message). The best way to avoid messing up the locks or accidentally taking them with you, is to just hang the lock from the metal hinge on the cabinet's roof.

Please don't share the lock combination with anyone, including UU members. Only current drop-off subscribers may use the drop-off service. We would appreciate your support directing people with drop-off questions or issues to contact us.

We also want to remind you that UU members who have subscribed for the drop-off service can also use the drop-off cabinets located at Bloomingfoods East and West. Please note that, while we have a working partnership with Bloomingfoods who has kindly allowed us place drop-off cabinets at their stores, Bloomingfoods staff are **NOT** responsible for the cabinets and importantly, they don't know the lock combination. Please contact us directly to report any issues with the cabinets instead of trying to get any assistance from Bloomingfoods staff.

Please refrain from dumping yard-waste in the drop-off bins; the drop-off service is meant for food-waste and other organic materials that would otherwise be dumped in a trash can; there are many yard-waste removal services in the area and the drop-off cabinets are not meant for yard-waste collection. You may dump small amounts of yard-waste, such as dry flowers or herbs, for example, as long as they fit in your blue pail. Larger amounts of yard-waste take too much space and prevent other users from dumping their compostable materials in the shared bin.
