CELEBRATE OUR TOP TEN FOR 2016!



Took twenty students, staff, and other volunteers to join students from campus ministries across the Arkansas Conference to do home repair with Jacob's Ladder in Memphis, TN, and tornado recovery work in Holly Springs, MS.

Doubled our interns on staff and added a Resident Manager for 2016–2017. Hired an Alumni and Development Coordinator, with the position expanding to full-time in early 2017.

Opened the new Wesley House on Lindell Avenue, just adjacent to campus! Hosted more than 220 people at a Consecration Service in April!

Added two new weekly ministries for students – Freshmen Community and Midweek Prayer and Communion Service. Freshmen Community will become a full-fellowship Dessert and Bible Study this spring.

Launched the Extra Mile Club to encourage monthly giving to our three crucial ministry funds: Missions, Operations, and Building. By the end of 2016, twenty-four donors had given \$17,409 through the Extra Mile Club.

Increased involvement with 90 students attending Tuesday night Wesley over the fall semester and an average of 40-45 students every night. Added 26 new active students to the Wesley fellowship since January 2016.

Added four new District Church representatives to our Advisory Council, bringing our total churches represented to nine. Quadrupled the size of our Fundraising and Development Committee.

Raised \$11,424 for missions, including \$1,855 through our weekly student offering and \$6,400 through Work Weekends, during which 34 students and staff participated.

Reached out to more than 500 students over summer and fall Welcome Weeks. More than 270 students attended the first annual Lindell Avenue Block Party, hosted by the Baptist Collegiate Ministry and U of A Wesley.

Received \$60,901 for our Operating Fund beyond support from Central UMC and the Conference. Raised \$157,347 for our Building Fund. Received a \$50,000 naming pledge for the Nita Lindsey Great Room and a \$15,000 naming gift for the Forum Kitchen. Made a \$30,000 principal payment on the building loan, reducing our debt to \$320,000.
