Louisiana Administrative Code Subchapter B: General Provisions, §123 Definitions	<p>Client — recipient of services, advice, education and/or recommendations for activities related to wellness and preventive services including conditioning, injury prevention, reduction of stress, or promotion of fitness</p> <p>Patient — the recipient of physical therapy services pursuant to a plan of care, treatment plan or program</p>
New Jersey Administrative Code 13:39A-3.10 SEXUAL MISCONDUCT	<p>"Patient" means any person who is the recipient of physical therapy examination, evaluation, instruction, or treatment rendered by a licensee.</p> <p>"Patient-therapist relationship" means a relationship between a licensed physical therapist or a licensed physical therapist assistant and a patient wherein the licensee owes a continuing duty to the patient to render physical therapy services consistent with his or her training and experience.</p>
Oregon Administrative Rules 848-045-0020 (2)(n)	Engages in any sexual conduct, including dating, with a patient, whether initiated by the patient or the licensee. For purposes of this subsection, "patient" includes any person who has not been discharged from that therapist's care;
Washington Administrative Code 246-16-020 (5)	"Patient" or "client" means an individual who receives health care from a health care provider
International Examples of Defining “Patient”	
Physiotherapy Alberta (CA) College and Association, Standards of Practice, Glossary	<p>Patient (in regards to Sexual Abuse and Sexual Misconduct Standard): An individual is a patient of a physiotherapist when they are a recipient of physiotherapy services and a therapeutic relationship is formed. This occurs when a physiotherapist has engaged in one or more of the following activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Gathered clinical information to assess an individual • Contributed to a health record or file for the individual • Provided a diagnosis • Provided physiotherapy advice or treatment • Charged or received payment from the individual or third party on behalf of the individual for physiotherapy services provided • Received consent from an individual for recommended physiotherapy services
Health & Care Professions Council (UK) Standards of Conduct, performance and ethics	<p>Service user</p> <p>Anyone who uses or is affected by the services of registrants, for example, patients or clients.</p>
